I-land and Nw Brunswick Belgian Relief Committees the Steamer "Renegloss" for the purpose of carrying further supplies to the stricken people of Belgium. This ship will be available about December Twentieth and will sail on or about December 25th. The Belgian Relief committee has authorized me to request further donations of cash, clothing and food stuffs. THE LONGEST ONE (From the London Advertiser). Two men stood on a hill watching the German supply trains creep out of Essen: "What is the first train?" asked the stranger. "Why that is ammunition for the Krupp guns," was the informed man's reply. "What is the longer train?" was the next question asked. "Oh, those are the bombs the Kaiser wants to give the British babies for Christmas," came the answer. "And there is a third train pulling out. It is longer than the other two." "That is loaded with beer, and sauerkraut and pretzels." "But here's a fourth that is almost a mile long. What form of supplies can require such a transport?" "Oh, that's easily explained; that train carries the Iron Crosses. Great Britain may well feel proud and boast of her military decoration, the Victoria Cross which is only conferred for conspicuous acts of bravery on the field of battle. France confers her distinctive badges in the well known form of the Legion of Honor. Austria confers her ancient order of Marie Therese. Germany's equivalent of the Victoria Cross is the Iron Cross, which, it is said, the Kaiser has already given to 38,000 of his soldiers in the present war. Russia distributes her cross of St. Vladimir sparingly to her successful soldiers. Denmark has one of the most illustrious orders of chivalry, the order of the Elephant, which ranks even with that of our order of the Garter. Spain is truly proud of her order of the Golden Fleece, which is and has been most sparingly conferred. Italy never fails to decorate her soldiers with her military medal of merit. Rich as the Tower of London has always been in armor, it has, only recently, been very much improved by valuable gifts from King George V. The King was told that he possessed at Windsor Castle certain pieces of very old armor which really formed parts of Tower suits, and he accordingly gave orders that these should be sent to the city, so as to complete the sets there. The armor is very old indeed, having belonged to King Henry VIII., William Somerset, the Earl of Worcester and others. The helmet of the latter warrior alone weighs close to twenty pounds. These additions are by far the finest made to the Tower armories since the year 1661, when the whole collection was brought from Greenwich, Hampton Court, and other palaces, and placed in its present position.
