That consolidated schools are appreciated in other provinces than Prince Edward Island is shown by the following Ottawa despatch where several districts have decided to build a school at their own expense:—School sections No. 9, Osgoode, No. 20, Mountain and No. 20, Osgoode, in Russell country, at a joint meeting held at Vernon, decided to establish a consolidated school along the lines of the Sir William Macdonald scheme. The work will be undertaken at their own expense. Provided the township council ratifies the proposal, the school will be inaugurated at Vernon this year.

At a meeting of the town council, Shediac held on the 21st inst, the contract for laying the system of water works for the town was awarded to the Maritime Contracting and Mining Co. Ltd. of Charlottetown, P. E. Island, T. MacLean manager, the work to be completed by the last of October next. Work on the elevated storage tank and on the reservoir at the pumping station will be commenced at once. The different tenders were as follows:

E. LaRoi Willis of Sydney, arrived here yesterday from Sussex. He leaves this morning for Colaba with his stallion Lord Alverston. Mr. Willis says his horse would have done better at Sussex if he had been given more work in preparation for the race. Alverston he declares, has lots of speed and his accomplishment at Sussex in the first heat indicates that Mr. Willis is not exaggerating at all.—St. John Sun.

The first stone of the new market house was laid yesterday and quite a lot of stone was put in place before dinner time. Work was begun on the south east corner. Stone is to be obtained from the Swan's quarry, Mt. Edward Road as well as from Holland Cove and it is expected that the construction work will now proceed briskly. E. J. Duffy is in charge of the workmen and Mr. Cosman who was foreman of the reservoir last year is also engaged on the market building.

Reports reached the city yesterday of the severe effects of the thunder and lightning storm of Sunday afternoon and evening. The storm was very severe both in the eastern and western parts of the Province and did considerable damage. At Souris a barn owned by G. B. McEachern was badly shattered by the lightning which also entered the Souris station house, burned out the telegraph wires and singed the interior of the office. The railway fence back of the station was also struck and some panels torn off while the telephone wires were burned out in several places throughout the town.

At Nail Pond the house of Joseph H. Arsenault, clerk at J. H. Myrick's store, Tignish, was struck by lightning. The roof was torn off the house and the whole of the upstairs rooms were shattered to pieces. The family had not gone to bed when the house was struck, otherwise they would have been all killed. As it was they were all prostrated by the shock. The oldest son of the family received a very heavy shock, and it is doubtful if he will recover. He is badly burned about the arms and the body and on one leg. He remained stunned about six hours, but by the concentrated efforts of Drs. Murphy and Wickham they managed to restore him to consciousness at the end of that time. Mr. Arsenault's wife had the shoes torn from her feet and one foot badly fractured. The boy was standing near the wall with his elbow resting against it when the fluid emerged from the plaster and he received the terrible shock. Other members of the family also received the shock at the same time, but not with such force. The storm started about 8:30 and was most violent until near ten. It lasted nearly all night but in a more modified form. A barn belonging to William Roberts, Jr., at Middleton, was struck about eight o'clock and burned to the ground with all its contents. The storm abated towards morning leaving the atmosphere in a state that greatly resembled winter. At Summerside yesterday snow fell in small particles.
