—The dredge Deiver, which has been in port for the past week, will be ready for work on Monday. The Deiver, which is one of the largest dredges in Canada, is owned by the Dominion Trading Company of Ottawa to whom the contract of straightening the channel from the Lighthouse in was awarded by the Liberal Government last September, on the representation of Hon. J. W. Richards. She is a "dipper" dredge with a capacity of 3000 cubic yards a day, has fourteen men on board and will be engaged here at least all of next summer. She is in charge of Captain Kingston, who with his wife and two children will be residents of Summerside during the plant's stay here and whom we cordially welcome to our citizenship. The attendant plant consists of the tug, MacNaughton, in charge of Captain Powell, and two steel scows each having a capacity of 550 cubic yards.—S' Side Etc.

The governor and his wife and thirty Manchus, however, have been beheaded.

The rebels are maintaining order and the new arrivals say that their administration is excellent. The whole province of Shan Si is supporting the movement. Mukden and Newchwang are controlled by defense societies consisting of troops and civilians. The conditions in these practically amounts to independence.

### NEW SHIP FOR THE CANADIAN NAVY

HALIFAX, Nov. 13—The Canadian Gazette, of London, says—The British armored cruiser about leaves Malta for England about Nov. 25, and will, it is understood, be replaced in the Mediterranean by the cruiser Roxburgh. It is stated that the about has been sold to the Canadian Government.

The about is an armored cruiser of 12,000 tons. She mounts two 9.2 inch guns, 12 6-inch quickfiring, and a similar number of 12-pounders, and she has two submerged torpedo tubes. Launched in 1906 at a total cost, including armament, of £2,111,800. She is consequently not of a new type, and has Belleville boilers and reciprocating engines. She is nominally a 21 knot ship, but in service her best speed has been just over 18 knots. At this rate of steaming she uses from 18 to 19 tons of coal an hour. She has complement of 755 officers and men. Her sister vessels are the Sotley, Cressy, Hogue, Bacchante, and the government from his home in
