Resolution Opposing Extension of Monopoly to Telephone Company

At a meeting of the Council of the Board of Trade yesterday afternoon with the President in the chair the following resolutions were unanimously adopted.
 Resolved that in the opinion of this Board it would be inadvisable to further extend the monopoly now held by the Prince Edward Island Telephone Company.

Further resolved that any subsidy granted to the Company be made subject to the following conditions: first, that the Company shall furnish annually a statement of its affairs to the Government; Second, that the Company furnish a statement to the Government of all the bonuses in additional stock or otherwise, heretofore issued to the shareholders; Third, that the Company construct a direct exclusive telephone line between Charlottetown and Summerside in addition to the present lines; Fourth, a material reduction in the present telephone rents and tolls; Fifth, privacy of central telephone offices and the removal of telephone offices from country stores; Sixth, more prompt connection and more efficient service.

An adjourned meeting of Town Council to consider the Russell street question was held Monday night. The Council on the casting vote of the mayor decided to exchange street properties. This agreement will allow the street north of Mr. Clark's mills to remain open and the proposed street through his yard and across the railway will remain closed. Neil McLeod asked for an appropriation of \$50 a year for the public library.



EDITOR'S MAIL.
A HINT TO FARMERS.

Sir:—In many of the Island farmer cow stables in April and May the cattle are in poor condition and this is often the case where the owners have plenty of grain to give them. The result will be that the flow of milk in summer and fall will be so small that keeping milk cows will not pay and the contents of the farmer's pocket book will shrink accordingly. The principal cause of this is that grain has formed no portion of their daily winter ration.
 The best results are to be had from a balanced ration. Cattle as well as horses in the spring are really in need of a nerve tonic, more so than at any other season of the year, and the black oats and the white oats differ in that the black oats produce an appreciably larger amount of nerve tonic than the white oats. (So writes Professor Saunders of the Experimental Farm at Ottawa). Although it is to be observed that the white oats produce more meal and (slightly more nutriment to the bushel than the black oats and this leaves but little choice between black oats and white oats for cows, but the black oats are no doubt better for horses who are much on the road.
 It is impossible to bring milk cows through the winter on oats, straw and wheat bran and roots in that condition they ought to be when they arrive at the parturient stage. In summer when cows have plenty of grass or even when grass gets scarce it is more than doubtful if any part of a grain ration would pay the ordinary farmer.
