THE new theatre at Stewiacke is to be opened very shortly. The hall will hold 500 or 600 people and the stage is being finely equipped. Charles Horton, the well-known painter, of this city, painted the scenery and left today with it for Stewiacke, where it will be mounted under his direction. On the proscenium curtain is a pretty marine view, "The First Shot of Trafalgar," showing seven big battleships under full sail and in line, and the fierce shell fire falling short into the water. The view is prettily bordered with imitation onyx columns and crimson drapery. The stage is about 19 by 18 feet. The sets painted include a fancy interior a plain interior, a wood and a landscape.

THERE is now under construction across the St. Lawrence at Quebec, a cantilever bridge, which, when complete, will contain the longest span of any bridge yet erected, not even excluding the great cantilevers of the Forth Bridge in Scotland. The structure is of the cantilever type, and consists of two approach spans of 210 feet each, two shore arms, each 500 feet in length, and a great central span 1,800 feet in length. The total length of the entire bridge is 4,210 ft and although in extreme dimensions it does not compare with the Forth Bridge, which is about 1 mile in extreme length, it has the distinction of having the longest span in the world by 90 feet, the two cantilevers of the Forth Bridge being each 1,710 feet in length. The total width of the floor is 80 feet, and provision is made for a double-tracked railway two roadways for vehicles, and two sidewalks. In a cantilever of this magnitude the individual members are necessarily of huge proportions, the main posts, for instance, being 325 feet in length, and each weighing 700 tons.

THE I. C. R. is very short of coal for locomotives at Moncton and the fuel department is hustling to get in a supply before serious embarrasments occur. The supply of coal at Moncton yesterday was reported to be so low that traffic was in danger of being considerably interrupted thereby. Owing to the heavy storm of last week and the still heavier storm of this week along the railway east, very little coal has been hauled by the I. C. R. of late. The consequence is that the heavy drain made on the short supply at Moncton has about exhausted the bin and left the stores department hard up against the necessity of having rush orders filled yesterday without delay. The whole trouble has been brought about by the shortage of motive power. During the recent storms the I. C. R. management had their hands more than full to keep the express trains running. Many of the express trains had to be cancelled, principally because there were not engines enough to plow out the road and run trains at the same time. The shortage of motive power is the chief cause of the difficulty in getting trains over the Intercolonial. Moncton Times.

QUEBEC POLITICS.

The Conservative press has so frequently nominated Mr. Gouin for the Premiership of Quebec that it has ceased to be a joke, and has become a nuisance to the Minister of Works and his friends. That he is likely to become Premier should Mr. Parent drop out is very generally admitted, but that he desires to steal his chief's shoes while that gentleman is having a bath is absolutely untrue, and presents Mr. Gouin in a very unfair light. The Hon. Lomer Gouin is a man of forty three years of age and of splendid physical as well as mental development. He travelled the path of many French-Canadian public men, and entered the Legislature as a rising young barrister in 1897, after having in 1891 fought a losing fight against Sir Hector Langevin for a seat in the Commons. He has been a Minister since 1900, and is an enthusiast in the great work of opening up northern Quebec. Mr. Gouin is a son-in-law of the late Hon. Honore Mercier.—Globe.
