THE RESULT IN PRINCE.

The voting in Prince County yesterday resulted in a handsome majority for the repeal of the Scott Act in order that the Prohibitory Law may take its place. In this splendid result the County has met our expectations while Summerside has surpassed our brightest hopes.

The majority of 170 for Prohibition in Summerside is especially gratifying and does credit to that energetic and progressive town. Congratulation is due to the Central Temperance Committee in Summerside, to the clergymen of all creeds and to the temperance workers throughout the County for their active, judicious and successful campaign.

Jack London, a Socialist author, says there are in London 1,800,000 persons who receive twenty-one shillings a week or less in wages. One million eight hundred thousand people live on the poverty line or below it and another million live with one week's wages between them and pauperism.

Australia has been dealing unfairly with Canada in the matter of customs duties, charging the duty on the value at point of original shipment with the transportation charges to the ocean shipping port added. This was a discrimination against the all-Canadian route via Vancouver and in favor of New York. A concession has now been made which equalizes matters.

It is high time that the annual report of the City was ready. The citizens are clearly entitled to have the detailed accounts before them with time to read, mark and inwardly digest them before taking part in the election. If there is any excuse for the delay in publication of the report it should be at once made known through the press.

A serious scandal developed in the Saskatchewan elections. In Prince Albert where the Government candidate was returned, the deputy returning officer and poll clerk for a remote portion of the constituency have been convicted of fraud and fined \$200 each. They did not visit the polling place to which they were assigned, and of course held no poll but forged returns giving the Liberal candidate 150 majority at that poll. Their punishment is absurdly inadequate. The member elected has thrown up the seat and a new election must be held.

In political discussions and forecasts one point is usually left out of account and yet is of vital consequence—mortality. Take an instance: When the Liberal party came into power in 1896 the Senate was overwhelmingly Conservative. There were some 72 Conservative Senators and but nine Liberals in that House. Since then death has been busy among the old men of the Red Chamber. Now there remain only 32 Conservative Senators. There are 46 Liberals and nine vacancies. When these are filled there will be 55 Liberal Senators, a majority of 23, as against a Conservative majority of 23 only nine years ago. Death has wrought the change. The vacant seats are two in Nova Scotia, two in New Brunswick, two in Alberta, two in Saskatchewan and one in Ontario.
