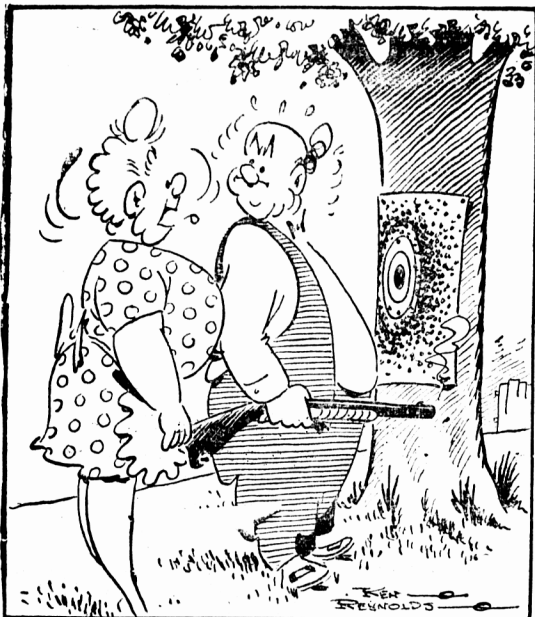

TWO GUIDES TO THE RIGHT PLAY

The winning play in today's deal was a matter of "percentage" plus a reasonable inference from the bidding.

North, dealer. Neither side vulnerable. 1062 3854 AKQ8 8754 A6 32 106 AKQ8 3 KQ10 9 8764 AKQJ9 732 J8 743

The bidding: North East South West 1 Pass 1 Pass 1NT Pass 3 Pass 4 Pass 3 Pass

South would have been far shrewder to raise the notrump and to forget about his 100 honors in the spade suit. A four-spade contract might be unmakeable, whereas nine tricks at notrump figured to be relatively easy. However, the actual contract should have been fulfilled. West opened the heart ace and, when his partner played the ten, continued the suit. East won the second lead with the heart nine, cashed the heart king, and led the heart queen. Declarer ruffed, then

drew the four rounds of trumps necessary to extract West's cards in the suit.

On the fourth trump lead, a discard had to be made from dummy, and after much pondering South decided to let go the diamond queen in order to keep all four of the clubs. Obviously, he hoped that the club suit would break 3-3 and permit a diamond discard, so that he would not have to take the diamond finesse. Unfortunately however, this plan did not work. East had a club stopper, and that was that.

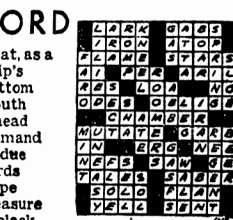
The play for the 3-3 club break had substantially less chance than the straight 50% play for the diamond finesse. Besides, South should have realized that East, who had shown the K-Q-10-9 of hearts probably would have overcalled the club bid with one heart if he had also held the diamond king.

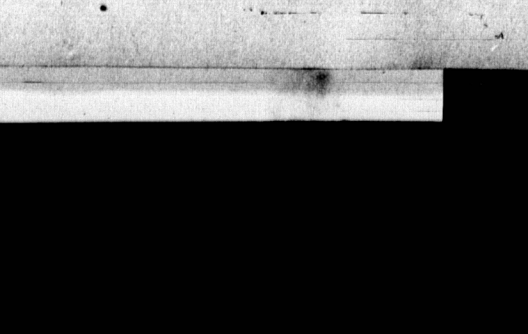

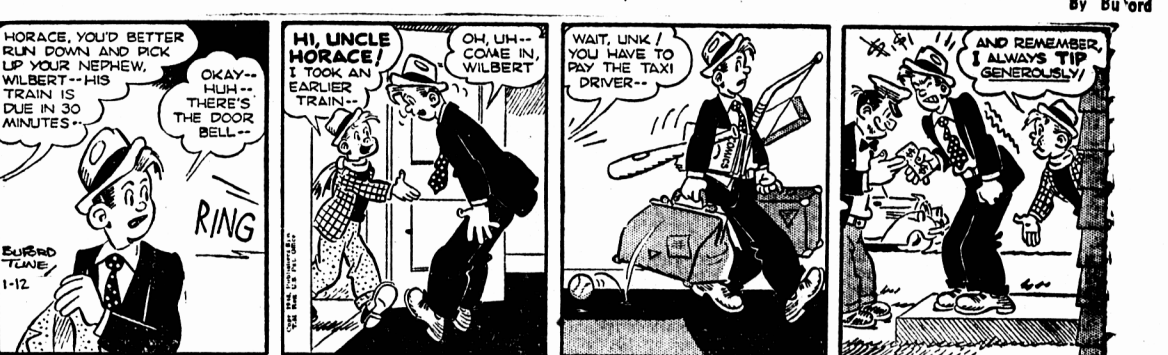

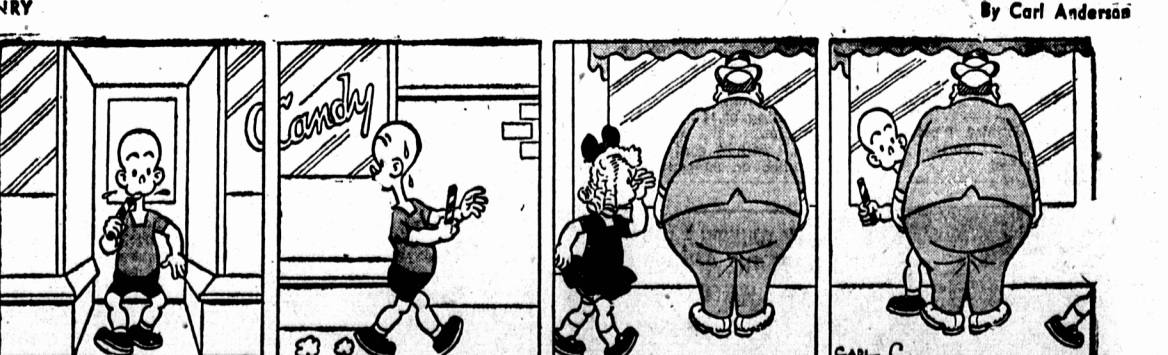
