ROTARY LUNCHEON.—The Rotary Club held their weekly luncheon yesterday at the Rose and Grey, about fifty persons being present. Rotarian R. C. Sidenius presided. The speaker for the occasion was Colonel R. H. Campbell, Superintendent of Education who gave a thoughtful address on Primary Education. He dwelt on the outset on his remarks upon the value of education as a safeguard of our civilization in this democratic age, and of the need of a thoroughly sound education as the foundation of our subsequent educational work. He pointed out that all power lies today in the hands of the masses of men and women who, if they are to decide wisely, the great questions coming to the surface, must be able to think clearly and act justly. In other words they want to be well educated. He spoke of the conditions as they exist in our schools today, the good work the teachers are doing and the very small remuneration and urged that we should be prepared to spend more money to obtain the kind of education required. Colonel Campbell pointed out the expenditure in this Province for education is comparatively low. He dealt with the hindrances to good work naming among others the following:—The one room school; immature teachers; irregularity of attendance caused namely by lack of appreciation of the value of education, and also lack of community spirit and lastly materialistic conception of education. Col. Campbell's address was listened to with much attention and that the audience appreciated his remarks was evidenced by the marked applause which he received. This was the first time that the Rotary luncheon was held at the new Rose and Grey and the members were delighted with the splendid appointments and excellent service.
