INDUSTRIAL ALCOHOL SHORTAGE
To waste the war in 1944, the United States will need 640,000,000 gallons of ethyl alcohol—five times our normal consumption. Vast quantities are used in making synthetic rubber, explosives, medical supplies and plastics. Synthetic textiles, tens of millions of gallons are being poured into Britain and Russia. To meet these urgent needs, only 590,000,000 gallons are in sight from present production—a shortage of 50,000,000 gallons of ethyl alcohol.
