DISGRACEFUL SCENE WHEN U. S. FLIERS ARRIVE

Farrell Smashed Hinton in Jaw When Told of Letter. Airmen Quarrelsome. Farrell Said he had Been Double-Crossed Regarding Publication of Story.

MATTICE, Ont., January 12.—The three American balloonists reached here from Moose Factory today safe and well, bringing with them a splendid tale of high adventure that was marred by bitter feeling which culminated when Lieut. Stephen A. Farrell smashed Lieut. Hinton in the jaw. Twenty persons saw the attack from which Hinto, covering his face with his arms, refused to defend himself, and which did not end till bystanders had forcibly intervened. Farrell accused Hinton of having double-crossed him because Hinton's letter to his wife, giving details of the actual experience, was published in a New York newspaper. Farrell, a veteran of twenty-six years navy service, also bitterly and heatedly resented the picture Hinton's letters painted of him, which represented Farrell's conduct as either cowardly or hysterical.

Hinton at first denied writing the letters, then admitted in Farrell's presence that his words were exaggerated, though insisting he had been accurate in a general way. Later in Farrell's absence he reverted to a declaration that his statements that Farrell wanted to commit suicide or to have the others kill and eat him and that Farrell went through the woods apologizing to heaven for his sins, were true.

Farrell emphatically denied all Hinton's statements regarding himself insisting that both he and Kloor were in far better physical shape in the days the men wandered in the woods, than was Hinton. Kloor before he received from Secretary Daniels an order directing him to file a report before talking for publication, denied Hinton's statement that Farrell wanted to others to eat him.

The breach between the men is unhealed and the bitterness of their separation only prevented from getting worse because Farrell is keeping his distance from the others. The three left here at 4.38 Wednesday afternoon for Toronto. They reached there Thursday at three in the afternoon and passed long enough to be entertained by the Mayor and the Rotary Club before returning to New York.

A PRACTICE JAUNT.

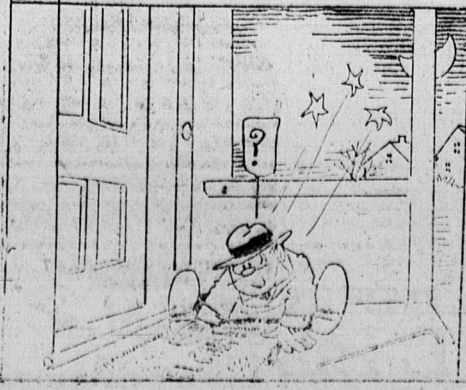
Next in interest to the deplorable fight between American Navy officials on foreign soil were the revelations that their flight was merely a practice jaunt taken on their own initiative though with the sanction of the Rocaway naval station commander and executive officer. They disclosed further that they started off in a balloon in which the gas was ten days old, the craft thus having lost much of its buoyancy because of air inflation, that they had no maps or charts except a Canadian railroad time table that Farrell happened to be carrying and that they took rations for only three days and not a drop of water.

The men had a rigorous but not very eventful journey down the Missinable trail from Moose Factory arriving here at 2.15 this afternoon.

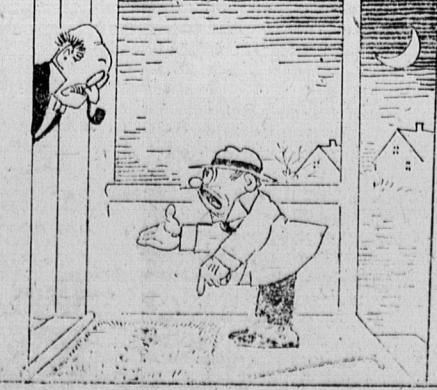

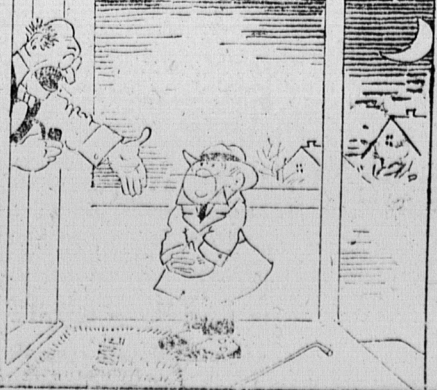
