Stock Markets At A Glance

CHICAGO, May 16 (AP)—Moderate offerings were uncovered in new wheat contracts today when prices jumped five cents to ceiling levels. The March delivery sold one time below its maximum but the price then immediately returned to the ceiling. Both old and new contract oats futures were fractionally lower.

MONTREAL, May 16 (CP)—Levels of security prices were down on average for the third successive session in transfers today on the stock exchange and curb market though some strong spots showed up here and there, notably in liquors.

TORONTO, May 16 (CP)—Although the general tempo of the trade was a bit drab in today's Toronto exchange session, the market harbored some interesting features with Beaulieu Yellowknife in the leading role. This issue, in the face of reports questioning the ore development project, climbed 38 cents to close at 2.08, a new high. Beaulieu traded 306,000 shares.

NEW YORK, May 16 (AP)—Stocks generally turned to the recovery side in today's market although exceptions were plentiful. Dealings were slow from the start although large blocks of low-quoted utilities helped expand volume to 1,140,000 shares compared with 1,030,000 Wednesday. Gains of fractions were noted in two points predominated at the close, with a few thin "wider climber." The Associated Press stock average was up 4 of a point at 79.3 after three successive falling sessions.
