**BOILER EXPLOSION RESULTS FATALLY**

Frederic Profit of Coleman Killed Instantly.

John McKay is Dangerously Injured, and A. McKinnon also Hurt. Building Destroyed and Other Damage.

A SAD and fatal accident happened at Coleman yesterday morning about 7.30 o'clock, by which a young man named Frederick Profit of that place lost his life and another, John McKay, was perhaps fatally injured. The accident was the explosion of the boiler in the steam saw mill of Angus A. McKinnon. Mr. Profit who was the fireman was killed instantly, having nearly every bone in his body broken. John McKay, another employee was badly injured, chiefly about the head and is in a dangerous condition. Mr. McKinnon owner of the mill was also hurt receiving a bad though not serious cut on his forehead and was otherwise shaken up. There were two others, employees in the mills at the time, namely Ambrose McDonald and Angus Campbell of Brae both of whom escaped without a scratch.

The boiler was blown to atoms and the building badly shattered. Debris was hurled about one hundred yards distant and the Railway station near by was slightly damaged.

The deceased young man, Mr. Profit was about 21 years of age and unmarried. He leaves to mourn a mother, Mrs. John Gray residing at Coleman, besides two half brothers and one half sister.

The injured man McKay is a son of Neil McKay of Coleman.

The boiler is said to have been a very old one, and it was, The Guardian learns, Mr. McKinnon's intention to have it replaced by a new one in the near future.

Coroner James Barclay of O'Leary was summoned and held an inquest in the afternoon. A verdict was rendered to the effect that the deceased came to his death through accident while the jury attached some blame to the owner and foreman of the mill.

At a late hour last night Mr McKay's condition was reported no better and the physicians have little or no hopes of his recovery. Drs. McEwen and McDougall of O'Leary are attending him.
