ALL NEWS OF LOCAL INTEREST

The steamer Halifax is due at noon today.

The McGill exhibition examinations will be taken this season by John McKenna, Hartsville and Wm. McMillan, Montague.

The Prince of Wales College lectures close to-day and the seasonal examinations commence to-morrow. The College will close on Friday, May 29th.

The S. S. Aarsleth from Liverpool with twenty-six thousand bags of salt for Peaks Bros. & Co., came in port yesterday morning at nine o'clock and anchored in mid stream.

The Coban sailed yesterday afternoon at four o'clock with cargo comprising 95 head of cattle shipped by E. Wheatley and Joseph Wise; 8 horses, 75 sheep, 720 bags oats, 520 bags potatoes and turnips and 400 lbs pork and meats shipped by the Dominion Packing Company.

The P. E. Island schooner Empress, wrecked on Black Island, and owned by G. W. Wightman, Montague Bridge, was hoisted Saturday night by Beasley Bros. wrecking company. She is now in Port La Tour. Divers are repairing the leak. It is expected the schooner will leave in three or four days for Halifax.

An accident which happily did not have a fatal termination occurred at Donaldson Sunday last. The principal in the affair was William McIntyre of Mill Cove. While driving to church with his wife, the horse with a road cart driven by his two children a little boy and a girl behind took fright and started to run away. Mr. McIntyre jumped from the wagon and in endeavoring to stop the horse fell under his feet and was picked up in an unconscious condition. The children were thrown out of the road cart and Mrs. McIntyre out of the wagon, but none of them was seriously hurt. Both of the vehicles were badly damaged. At latest report last night Mr. McIntyre was recovering and had been removed to his own house about two and a half miles away. A very bad gash was made and an artery cut in the back of his neck, and the doctor had to put seven stitches in the wound.

The schooner Marsne, Capt. R. McLean, which arrived lumber laden from Miramichi on Saturday evening last while between Richibucto and West Point, met with a sudden gale from the north to the northwest, which jibed the mainsail, and Frank Williams a seaman, who was at the wheel was struck by the mainsheet which carried both himself and the wheel overboard. The accident was witnessed by the mate who dodged when the mainsheet broke and managed to save his own life. The schooner was disabled, but recovering, came up in the wind herself. No sound came from the man as he was struck, and it is thought that he was stunned by the force of the blow before he touched the water. Capt. McLean has a splendid record for life saving and this is the first time a man has been lost under him, and needless to say he feels deeply grieved over the accident. Every thing possible was done under the circumstances, but no trace of the unfortunate man could be distinguished. Williams was a young man, 19 years of age, a native of Brittany, France, and was highly esteemed by the captain and his messmates.

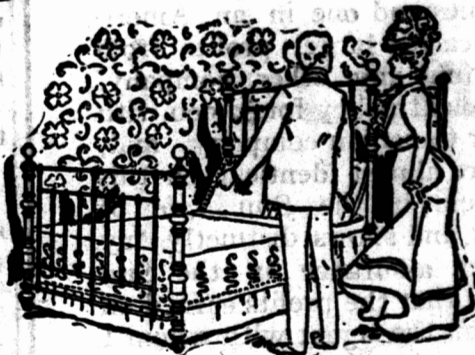
