Tarbush, Provincial Organizer, the Court has initiated into the mysteries of Forestry twenty-four new candidates, making a total of 43 members. On Friday night three candidates who intend going West, were received into the Court. The next regular meeting of the Court will be held at the home of Percy Mutch on Wednesday night, the 28th inst., at 8 o'clock, when the certificates will be presented to the newly initiated members.

The crop and live stock bulletin, published by the Department of Agriculture for Prince Edward Island, has just been received. The report tells of the weather, the temperature and the precipitation for May, June and July with a fairly well resume of the crop, dairy and live stock. As expected the hay crop is reported below the average, particularly in King's County. Only about half the hay was saved at time of writing report. The prospects for wheat and potatoes are above the average, corn, although showing a large increase in the quantity planted does not look favorable. The root crop is below the average, fruit below the average. There is a falling off in milk production and a decrease in all classes of live stock. The egg production is about ten per cent above that of last year.
