**—ANOTHER CAR BURNED—**At ten thirty Monday night the Summerside fire alarm rang and the firemen turned out to find the alarm was for a car, belonging to Mr. John Gallant, of Summerside, which caught fire from a short circuit. The motor sprinker went out to the scene of the fire, which was on the back road on the way to St. Eleanor's, but could do nothing to save the car. Mr. Gallant's car had only been purchased three weeks ago and was a new La Salle seven passenger sedan and cost \$4,500. The gas tank had fifteen gallons of gas in it. **—LIFE LONG RESIDENT PASSED AWAY—**In the passing of Mr. Robert Hutchinson on Sunday night the district of Lot 16 lost one of its most prominent and highly esteemed residents. Mr. Hutchinson was the son of the late Mr. and Mrs. William Hutchinson, and was born and lived all his life on the farm where he died. He was 64 years of age and in spite of the fatal disease from which he had been a sufferer for some years he always took a very active interest in all public matters until a short time ago. On Thursday last he took a paralytic stroke followed by another on Saturday evening from which he did not rally. The deceased was one of the most progressive farmers of the district and kept himself well informed on every subject which was to the advantage of the farmer and did all in his power to improve the conditions of the community in which he lived. He was a prominent member of the Orange Lodge, under whose auspices the funeral was held, the solemn ritual of the Order being observed at the grave. There are left to mourn one daughter and five sons, namely:—Stavert and Edmund in Western Canada; Wilfred, Chalmers, Calvin and Miss Etta all at home, to whom the sincere sympathy of the community is extended. The funeral took place on Tuesday afternoon at three o'clock, services being held at the house and United Church at Lot 16. Members from the Summerside L. O. B. A. were present at the services, which were conducted by Rev. Mr. Aitken, the Orangemen taking charge at the grave. Interment was in the family plot at Lot 16 beside those of his wife, formerly Miss Jennie Stavert of Wilnot, who predeceased him three years ago. S.
