OTTAWA, Oct. 28.—All the Ministers so far in the by-election yesterday were returned by acclamation, the only Minister still out of a seat is Hon. W. T. White, who will take George Taylor's former Constituency in Leeds.

Official returns for 1904 of 221 Constituencies for the recent election show the aggregate vote was 569,670 Conservatives and 531,896 Liberals.

## BLACK HANDERS AT WORK IN SYDNEY

SYDNEY, Oct. 28.—Police officers in search of money stolen from an Italian here last Sunday, who was assaulted and robbed, came upon a veritable arsenal of dangerous weapons and dynamite in an Italian house at Ward V today. The men who committed the assault and robbery are in jail, and the police were looking into their effects for \$200, which they had stolen from their victim. While searching their trunks officers McIntyre, McDonald and Edwards found four sticks of dynamite, three revolvers loaded, three razors and a pair of steel knuckles, with pointed prongs. The articles were removed and are now in the custody of the court. The hearing of the case against Constantino for assault and robbery of Styanoto comes up Monday. Fears that a black hand association is operating here is somewhat confirmed by the police find today.

## MINISTER OF MILITIA ON WESTERN INSPECTION TOUR.

OTTAWA, Oct. 29.—Colonel the Hon Sam Hughes, minister of militia and defense, left tonight for Hamilton to attend the Thanksgiving day maneuvers and sham battle. He will continue westward to the coast, accompanied by General Colin MacKenzie, on an inspection tour. The minister will be absent about three weeks.

## SENSATIONAL TURN IN MURDER CASE.

BOSTON, Oct. 28.—District Attorney Pelletier, it was learned today, will ask the Grand Jury to hand down two indictments instead of one in connection with the charge that the Rev. C. V. T. Richeson poisoned Avis Linnell, his former sweetheart. The District Attorney intends charging a man, who is a close friend of Mr. Richeson, with being an accessory after the fact in the case, because he spirited away from Richeson's room a grip of love letters written to the Minister by Miss Linnell shortly before her death. Mr. Pelletier decided to ask for

another indictment after her had endeavored without success to compel the lawyers for Richeson to surrender the letters.

The securing of these letters of which there are a trunkful, is said by the police to be of the greatest importance to both sides, as they are believed to contain statements that would greatly strengthen the case of the State against the accused pastor. For that reason District Attorney Pelletier, although defeated in the first attempt will make every effort to compel the Attorney of the defense to turn the grip over to him, and, of course, the defense will resist to the bitter end for the same reason.

Pelletier evidently saw this point even before he was arrested for he called Detective Brown on the telephone and told him to go to the rooms occupied by the pastor on Magazine Street and take charge of all letters and photographs found there. Burns obeyed, and thereby secured a point which may in the end be the one that will set the Minister free.

He then turned them over to the Attorney for the accused pastor. When the police visited the rooms of Richeson they found that everything bearing on the case had been removed.

The members of the Cambridge Emmanuel Baptist Church of which the Rev. Clarence V. T. Richeson is pastor, notified him today that they are standing by him. The congregation unanimously voted to withhold any comment on their pastor's arrest until after the Grand Jury has taken action.

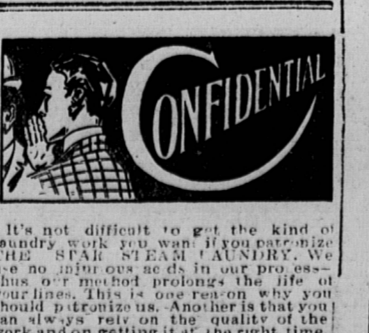
