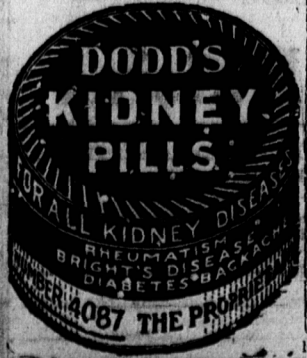

Percy Cantwell Gets Prized New England Appointment.
Percy J. Cantwell, former Adjutant of Providence Post, has

been appointed liaison officer between the American Legion and the Veterans' Bureau for the New England district. Announcement of Comrade Cantwell's appointment for this office, for which he is well fitted, was made at a meeting of the New England State Department Commanders in Boston. Comrade Cantwell will take up his new duties on April 1st, but Providence Post will not lose him altogether, for he will commute daily from Providence to Boston. 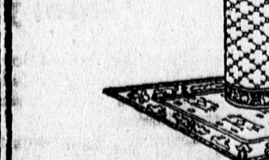

Want Report From Gen. Harrington

LONDON, Mar 20.—Gen. Sir Charles Harrington, commander-in-chief of the Allied forces in Constantinople, has been summoned to England to report on the general "military situation" in view of the coming renewal of the Allied conference with the Turks.

United States Ready To Mediate In Ruhr Trouble

WASHINGTON, Mar 21.—A statement made by the British embassy today in the form of a correction brought to the attention of the country for the first time that intimations had been received in England from America apparently by the British government from the United States government that the United States would be "able and willing" to offer assistance toward an adjustment of the complex situation arising out of French occupation of the Ruhr region if assured that the offer would be welcomed.

The British embassy's communique was intended to make clear a puzzling statement in the House of Commons on March 13, attributed to Ronald McNeill under secretary of state for foreign affairs in regard to the attitude of the United States toward the Ruhr situation.

TWO WOMEN PERISH IN FLAMES

DALHOUSIE, March 21.—A terrible calamity occurred yesterday morning when two women lost their lives in a fire which destroyed the home of Wadsworth Good. Mrs. Good was in the barn milking the cows when she noticed smoke coming from the direction of the house, she dashed into the burning building to save her aunt, Mrs. Douglas. Before help could reach them the women perished in the flames.

PRINCE HENRY THROWN FROM HIS HORSE

LONDON, March 21.—Prince Henry, third son of King George was thrown yesterday while exercising his horse at the Cavalry School at Weeton, according to the Daily Mail, the Prince suffered a slight concussion of the brain but is recovering.

ONLY TWO BIRDS HAVE MADE 300 EGG RECORD

TORONTO, March 20.—The annual report of Record of Performance "A" for the year 1921-22 will be ready for distribution within the next two weeks. This report contains detailed information regarding birds whose trap-nest records have been certified on the breeders' own premises by Government inspectors. The results are given of birds owned by one hundred and twenty-two breeders, representing every province.

sity of British Columbia, Vancouver, B.C. Of the 23,528 birds which have been entered in Record of Performance "A" since its inception in 1919, only two birds, including the one referred to above, have laid 300 eggs. Both were White Leghorns. One was in the city of Columbia and the other in Ontario.
