Court history Made yesterday At Georgetown

Court history was made in Georgetown yesterday. For the first time the Judge, Mr. Justice Arsenault, and Mr. H. Rogers, clerk of the Supreme Court, left Charlottetown yesterday at 9:30 a.m., held Court in Georgetown and returned to Charlottetown in time for lunch. They made the trip by Central Airways' two passenger Fairchild plane piloted by Airways Pilot Ashwood. The trip to Georgetown was made in fifteen minutes and the return trip in twenty minutes. Court met at eleven a.m. and adjourned at twelve noon. The Court House is now heated by steam instead of stoves. The Court House building is being renovated and when the work is finished the building will compare favorably with the Court Houses in Charlottetown and Summerside.

Grand Jury's Report

To His Lordship the Honourable A. E. Arsenault, Judge of the Supreme Court: May it please your Lordship: We, the Grand Jury of King's County, beg leave to report as follows: We have listened with pleasure

to the address of Your Lordship and heartily endorse same. Also we strongly recommend that the citizens of our country subscribe to the War Loan. We have inspected the Court House and Jail and find same in good repair. We respectfully submit same. (Sgd.) Bruce Webster, Foreman for self and others.

ADDRESS TO JURY

Following is Mr. Justice Arsenault's address to the Grand Jury: "Once again Kings County has the signal honor of having no criminal cases before the Court. It has the further distinction of having no civil jury case to be tried; in fact there is no case of any kind on the docket. If the world is at war you have at least the consolation of having peace among the citizens of your county.

"Since I last met you here the world's war has been further intensified by the unprovoked and dastardly attack of Japan on United States possessions followed by an immediate declaration of war by the United States on Japan and Germany.

"It is now quite evident that notwithstanding Japan's reiterated professions of her peaceful intentions, it had long been making secret preparations for her cowardly onslaught on the American Colonies; and at the very moment that diplomatic conversations were still in progress at Washington, Japan was launching hostile expeditions against the Philippine Islands. "It is rather bitter to now realize that the hundreds of thousands of tons of scrap iron, which for some years past the United States and Canada has been selling to Japan, have been and are now being manufactured into guns, tanks, and ammunition and used by this nation to try to destroy those very countries that supplied this material. In fact many thousands of tons of this material we ourselves, in Prince Edward Island, sold to this now enemy nation.

A Rude Awakening

"The unpreparedness of the British Empire for this world's contest is in some measure due to that element of British, as well as American, citizens who since the last season and out of season, that it was wrong for us to build ships of war, to give military training to cadets, to organize boy scouts, that there would never be another war and that all these expenditures were building a military spirit in the young and were a useless waste. Well these well-meaning pacifists have had a rude awakening and those in authority who harkened to them have had cause to regret it.

"So far, and except in the far eastern front where Russia is now giving back to Germany an ample dose of its own medicine, the Allies have met with a number of severe reverses. The disastrous losses at Pearl Harbour, Hong Kong, and Singapore have been depressing to us.

"Churchill had warned us of these and may be of further such reverses. We must not however, be downhearted. We have four-fifths of the world's population on our side, we have nine tenths of the world's resources. That powerful and resourceful nation, the United States, is only just now getting into its stride. Great Britain and the Dominions are now well under way in the manufacture of planes and tanks, and will soon attain equality with enemy nations and then surpass them. We must not, however, continue to lull ourselves in false security. We have successfully passed through fearful dangers, which in our state of unpreparedness might well have overwhelmed us; there are, however, still other dire dangers to face and to overcome.

The War Loan

"The need for materials and implements of war is great and pressing and every energy is now being directed to the manufacture of these. To this end, however, there is an urgent need of money and it is for this reason that Canadian citizens are earnestly solicited to subscribe to the war loan that has recently been launched.

"Those who have money in bank or elsewhere or in securities can accomplish no better act of 'safety-first' than by buying these war bonds. Nothing matters if we do not win. If we lose, this money and these securities will also be lost. If you have any doubt as to what you should do resolve these doubts at once, place this money in war bonds where it will do most good, and do it now.

"It matters not how much or how little you have, but it does matter that the little or the much should go towards swelling the grand total that Canada will subscribe. We cannot all do the fighting but at least by supplying the needs of the combatants, we can add to the
