THE Chatham World says: Capt. McCarthy of the P. E. I. schooner Levinis, feels sore at town officials. He arrived Saturday, and landed a bull. The Town Clerk, an hour or to later, called on him to pay the special tax that is imposed on these animals when they are sold or offered for sale in this port. Capt. McCarthy admitted that he had landed a bull, but denied that he had sold it or offered it for sale, and intimated that it was nobody's business what he intended to do in the future. At 6 o'clock that evening he was arrested, and had to get a bondsman, and go to the Police Magistrate's residence with him and the Town Marshal, to secure his liberty. Capt. McCarthy has been coming to this port for years, and is as well known as one of our citizens. He had a vessel at the wharf and a lot of freight, and there was no possibility of his sailing for three or four days. He, therefore naturally thinks that summons to appear on Monday and answer the charge would have been more courteous to him and more decent on the part of the town than the harsh proceedings that were taken. The case was proceeded with on Monday, and several witnesses were put on the stand in an endeavor to prove that the bull had been sold. None of them knew anything about the animal. The case was adjourned till Tuesday. On Tuesday Mr. Gaynor put the defendant's son on the stand and cross questioned him at great length and with much ability, endeavoring to elicit an admission that the bull was for sale the same as the rest of the cargo, but the young man declared he didn't know why the bull was on board or what was to be done with him, not having heard his father say anything about the animal. Mr. Gaynor for the town, and Mr. A. Lawlor for the defence, addressed the court. The Magistrate dismissed the charge, no evidence of a violation of the by-law having been produced.

Mr. Sutherland says that very little change has been made in the artillery manoeuvres. After the camp breaks up Mr Sutherland will go home to Quebec. -St John Sun.
