Great Cost of Producing Radium OTTAWA, April 23.—(By The Canadian Press)—Radium will retain its properties for about seven hundred years. Senator J. J. Hughes made a statement to this effect during the debate on radium in the senate the other day.

Dealing with the motion of Senator A. D. McRae that the Government take over the radium production in Canada, Senator A. C. Hardy thought the motion went too far.

The mover of the motion had suggested that the holders of Pitchblende claims in the Great Bear Lake district from which it is expected to recover radium, should receive generous treatment.

Pierre Laval

PARIS, April 23.—(Canadian Press Cable)—In the very appearance of Senator Pierre Laval, former Premier and now right-hand man of Premier Andre Tardieu in the French election campaign, there is something of the persistence of his native Auvergne.

While little Pierre was still doing chores around the family hostelry, his father planned a future for him. One day, perhaps, Pierre might succeed him in running the diligence between Vichy and Chateldon.

In politics, Laval began with the Socialist left and followed the usual progression towards the centre. A few weeks ago his last government fell for lack of three days.

The same night his resignation was in the hands of President Paul Doumer.

In the Upper House Laval is grouped with Senators officially belonging to no group. He is now Minister of Labor in the government of Andre Tardieu.
