We received the following cable from our London Department yesterday:—
Repatriation continues satisfactorily. About twenty-two hundred and eight hundred more to come. Many camps not yet evacuated. Men are being repatriated according to location of camp and not according to date of capture. Evacuating of Soltan now commencing.
