Empire Currency Fully Discussed

LONDON, April 13—(Canadian Press Cable)—Three Britons, two of them ministers in former governments and one a veteran economist, tonight came out before the Royal Empire Society strongly favoring the recent suggestion of H. H. Stevens, Canadian Minister of Trade and Commerce, for a British Empire currency.

Sir Robert Horne Chancellor of the Exchequer in the post-war coalition government and still a member of the House of Commons, made a plea for the reintroduction of silver into the world's monetary systems to mitigate the present gold shortage. He urged an agreement between nations of the British Empire to fix a ratio between silver and sterling, which, he said, would benefit the entire commonwealth and would be a means of developing extensive trade with the far East.

Livestock Market

MONTREAL, Que., April 13—(By the Canadian Press)—There were 58 cattle, 1,519 calves, 1,142 hogs and nine lambs for sale on the two Montreal livestock markets today, including about three loads of hogs held over.

The cattle offered were only common cows and bulls. Common to just fair cows brought \$2.25 to 533 with common bulls around \$2.75 to \$3.

Over the week end, including Saturday and today, 619 cattle have been received at Montreal enroute to Saint John for export to Great Britain via the Manchester Citizen, sailing April 14.

The calf trading was steady. The bulk of the sales were made between \$3.50 and \$4. Fairly good average quality calves brought from \$4 to \$4.25. One lot of about 80 calves averaging around 130 pounds was sold for \$4.65. Very common light calves and drinkers were weighed at \$2.50.

The few spring lambs offered brought \$5 and \$6 each.

Bacon, butchers and lights were quoted at \$4.75 to \$5. fed and watered. Sows were from \$3 to \$3.50. Western hogs were slow sellers bringing mostly \$4.75.

Ask Support For Cooperative System

(Canadian Press) TRENTON, N. S., April 13—Citizens of Trenton in mass meeting tonight passed a resolution moved by Rev. P. C. Lewis, setting forth that "under the present system we have intermittent periods of depression and unemployment whenever markets become gutted, thus keeping our people in a very uncertain and unsatisfactory position," and "respectfully asking the government to consider very seriously some co-operative system where by our natural resources and necessary machinery of production will be used to provide for the needs of the people and not for the profit of the few."

Another resolution sought work for the steel and car plants.

traffic ensuing therefrom," he added "has not yet grown up to the railway mileage."

When a vote was taken on the motion of Dr. McGibbon for the production of a photostat of the account of travelling and other expenses of C.N.R. officials resulted in a tie the chairman cast his vote against. Then Brig-General Stewart (Conservative, Lethbridge), said the country should know what expenses other than official were charged by officials of the road, and Sir Henry replied, "there is no such item."

Turning to salaries of officials and the saving effected by the 10 percent reduction, Mr. Boys told the committee that this economy would affect 828 officials, and amount to \$545,852 annually. In addition, there had been retirements and dismissals totalling 4,574 officers and clerks.

The chairman (R. B. Hanson)—"May I ask if the number of officers in the C.N.R. receiving \$10,000 and over is not considerably larger than the number employed by your chief competitor (the Canadian Pacific Railway)."

Mr. Boys—"It is and that opens up another question. The mileage that the Canadian Pacific have in Canada is 15,510, as compared with 23,767 on the Canadian National.

In any figures you can get in relation to the Canadian Pacific they do not embrace the lines over which the Canadian Pacific have control of stock. They are separate companies and are not included and the list of officials would not include officials of those lines.

WOULD BANKRUPT NATION

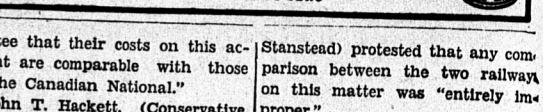

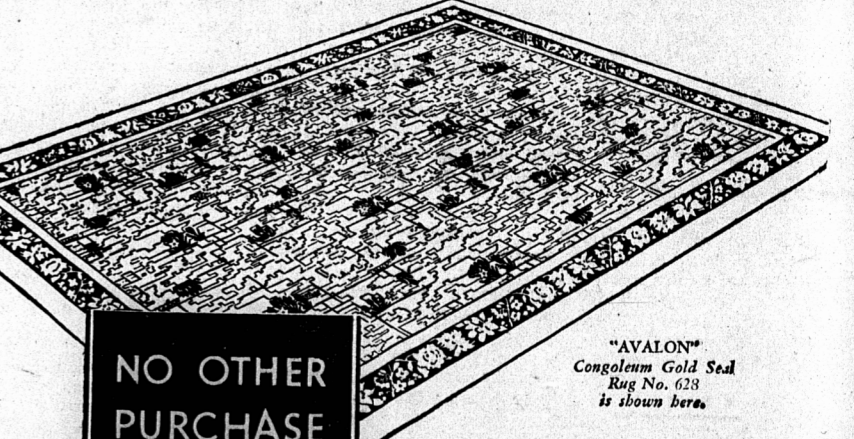

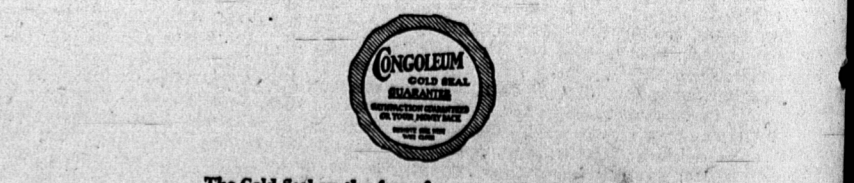
