OUR FIRE PROTECTION.

The Retail Merchants' Association invite the business men of Charlottetown to meet them in the City Council Chamber tomorrow, Tuesday evening 13:30 instant to confer together in regard to our fire protection service, the rates of insurance and what is necessary to be done in regard thereto.

At the result of a series of unfortunate incidents like the two fires just referred to, while notoriety has been given to the deficiencies of our fire alarm service, the want of trained horses in readiness to move the fire engine, the inadequate water pressure and other apparent defects.

It is well to look these matters fairly in the face, and no more fitting time could be chosen for the purpose than the beginning of the year. A prime requisite for security against fire is an abundant supply of water. This we do not now have.

These prime requisites for fire protection we need and must have, or failing that we must pay the increased fire insurance rates and take heavy risks besides. We believe it will be found to be a sound economy to make the best possible provision along the lines above indicated.

We hope to see a good attendance at the meeting tomorrow night, and we hope those present may deal with the matter in a practicable, business-like manner, as we doubt not they will do.
