WINNIPEG, Dec. 13 — (CP)—
Oats and barley futures moved in
a narrow range in moderately ac-
tive trade today on the Winnipeg
Grain Exchange.
Commission house and local sell-
ing, prompted by weaknesses at
Chicago, met shipper demand on
the decline. Barley was less active
traded than oats and came in for
moderate demand with prices firm-
ing up towards the close.
A carry-over of liquidation was
in evidence in rye trade, and prices
here too moved narrowly. Occa-
sional shipper demand came in and
prices closed around Saturday's
closing level.
Flax trade was dull and inactive,
with prices unchanged from Satur-
day.
In the only export business re-
ported, a small allocation of Cana-
dian wheat, less than 100,000 bush-
els, went to the United Kingdom
under the Anglo-Canadian wheat
agreement. Class two wheat prices
were unchanged from Saturday.
