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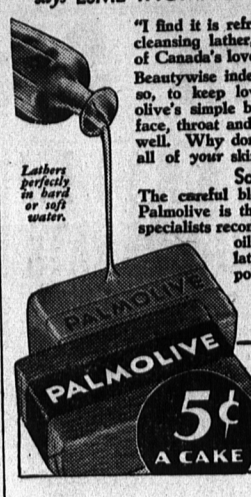
Everybody sets them down as pretentious fools and avoids them, but likely as not they are sensible enough on their own ground and would be agreeable if they stayed there.

These smart "self-help" costumes that close at the front, enable the youngsters to dress themselves. They're quickly fashioned because the sleeves cut in one with the shoulders.

Style No. 1687 is designed for sizes 2, 4 and 6 years. Pattern includes both models in the same size. If different sizes are wanted two patterns will have to be ordered and will cost 15c each. Size 4 requires yard of 35-inch material with 1/4 yard of 35-inch contrasting for girls' dress; boys suit takes 1/2 yard of 35-inch material for trousers with 1/4 yards of 35-inch material for blouse.
