French Reply to Britain is Regretted

LONDON, Dec. 12.—Contrary to British official expectations, the French Foreign Office has replied to Lord Curzon's last written communication with the result that the situation as regards the Franco-Kemalist treaty, which showed signs of improvement, has been rendered difficult.

The last British note, which stated the case with perfect frankness, left it open for the French Government to bring the whole matter up before the proposed meeting of foreign ministers. Instead of availing itself of this opportunity the Quai d'Orsay—or perhaps to be more correct, the Near East department—has seen fit to take up the points of the British note and enter into further explanations.

The main points of the French note related to the manner in which the French proposed to accommodate the terms of the Ankara pact with the London agreement, what security France offered and guaranteed to the Christian populations in the territory then proposed handing back to the Turks and what provision has been made to prevent the Turks using the Syrian railway for the transportation of troops to the Mesopotamian frontier.

Lord Curzon's note also indicated that there were certain concrete proposals that might be made with regard to clearing up the whole of the Near East question. This seems to have attracted the notice of the French authorities and a reply has been sent to the British Government shortly after the receipt of these proposals. This notwithstanding the fact that Lord Curzon's note made it perfectly clear in friendly terms that no good purpose could be served by continuing an academic correspondence.

Briefly put the French Government has failed to accept the conditions which would have led it out of a difficult position. The French note, which is of considerable length, goes into details showing how the Ankara pact in no wise breaks the agreement in which the Allies undertook not to sign a separate peace with any of the enemy states. In like manner it states that the Turks have given ample guarantee regarding the safety of the person and property of the Christian population in Cilicia.

Just how far these guarantees even by the Kemalists are valued may be seen by the wholesale abandonment of their homes and all their possessions in an endeavor to get out of the country before the arrival of the Turk.

Desperate appeals are being made directly and indirectly to the British Government for help for the Christian population. Lord Curzon in a reply to the American ambassador in Smyrna and Egypt makes the British attitude clear.

In British official circles it is stated that the consequence of another massacre in Cilicia on Anglo-French relations would be greater than has been in any other case on this matter. If the former actions of the Turks are in this instance repeated, it will undoubtedly react unfavorably on the possibility of a satisfactory settlement of the Near Eastern question, including the Greco-Turkish conflict.

LONDON, Dec 14—Georges Carpentier, who has completely recovered from his recent illness, according to the claims of his manager, Francois Descamps, will take over his training quarters at Maudslough to prepare for his bout with George Cook on January 12.

Carpentier's residence in the little Thames village is an old house formerly used by Frank Moran as headquarters.

Descamps has injected a little spice into the situation by producing an English butler as one of the outstanding figures of the Carpentier ménage, but the Frenchman's chief is as Parisian as they make 'em.

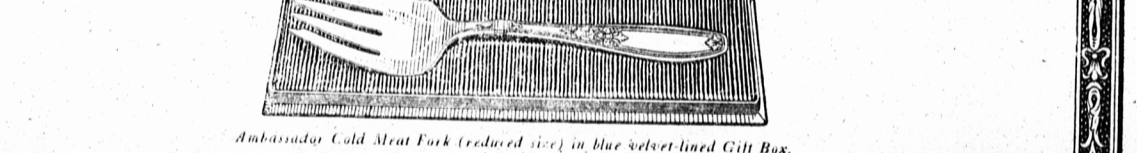
