MOLYNEUX SENT UP FOR TRIAL

will come to the conclusion that he did or said nothing more than ordinary matters would do under ordinary circumstances. I submit that if you take the actions of any man under ordinary circumstances and throw upon them the light of suspicion then every one of those acts will appear suspicious. But if you take away the idea of the alleged crime and ordinary events there will be nothing extraordinary in connection with them."
"As to prisoner's speaking about sudden deaths it is common knowledge that when a death occurs in the country it is one of the first things talked about when two or three persons meet. Was it any sign of guilt on the part of the prisoner that he should mention these to a neighbor."
"There is no particular evidence of any serious quarrel or disagreement between this man and his wife, but there is evidence that the woman had been acting strangely for months before this took place. The bell incident is an instance of how her mind was afflicted by little things. It seems ridiculous that this quarrel about the bell and the spilt milk should be such as would culminate in murder."
"As to prisoner's going for the pig it has been proved that McKinnon sent him a postal card to come, indicating that this was a bonafide transaction and that his going there was not premeditated."
"As to the medical evidence it leaves the matter entirely open. The post mortem appearances in both hanging and strangulation are practically the same excepting that the medical authorities seem to lean to the opinion that more symptoms are liable to be absent in hanging than in strangulation. The situation of the sink in the pantry was such as to have enabled the woman to have committed the act. There was an absence of any mark of a struggle and further if the evidence of Harry Molyneux is to be believed it would be impossible for the prisoner to commit the act for he would have but ten minutes to kill the woman, hang her up and go away."
In closing Mr. Stewart contended there was no evidence on which to send prisoner to Supreme Court for trial.
Stipendiary remarked that he had taken account and considered the evidence very carefully and he could come to no other conclusion than that there was sufficient evidence to justify him in placing the prisoner upon his trial. Consequently he committed him to the Supreme Court for trial which meets in Georgetown in July.
