ALBERTON Harbor has been open for a week or more. A company have purchased Woodman's Hall, Alberton and intend improving it during the summer.

THE W. C. T. U. meeting today at 3 p. m. Mrs. E. H. Wright will read a paper on, "The need of co-operation between parents and teachers." All are very welcome to attend.

JOHN McLEAY of Coleman who was badly injured by the boiler explosion in McKinnon's Mills on Tuesday was reported worse last night. He became unconscious yesterday afternoon and is said to be sinking.

THE Stanley left Georgetown about seven o'clock yesterday morning for Summerside, but on account of fog had to lay at Georgetown Harbor, until eleven o'clock, when another start was made. At four p. m. she was reported off Crapaud but the weather became thicker and the steamer did not reach here last night. It is believed that the northerly winds will clear the port without the assistance of the Stanley.

At the meeting of the Summerside Improvement and Tourist Association held last night, the Tourist Committee's report was discussed and some suggestions contained therein acted upon, viz: the matter of constructing bathing houses for which estimates were asked. The report also suggested the opening of a tourist bureau, and it was decided to open one at the office of the Secretary J. C. Jardine. The matter of holding a lecture on Island Scenery referred to by the Entertainment Committee was left in their hands to be dealt with.

It is now reported that the new election for Chief of Indians of this Province between John Sark and Joseph Francis, which was to have taken place on Monday last, has been postponed until some time in July.

The election which took place in January and February last was declared void on the protest of ex-Chief Sark on the grounds: (1) That a sufficient notice of holding said election was not given to the Indians of the Morell Reserve; (2) That the notice sent to the Indians of the said Morell Reserve of holding an election for Chief did not specify that only one poll was to be held and that at Lennox Island; (3) That at the former election for Chief in 1900 one poll was held at Morell and one at Lennox Island and that this year owing to the fact that no proper notice to the contrary a like poll was held at Morell and that the joint result of such two polls showed a majority of nine votes for Sark.

The result of the election protested was that Morell gave Sark twelve votes and Francis one vote; at Lennox Island Sark got 27 votes while Francis got 29 votes. The Returning Officer, it seems, ignored the Morell vote declaring that there should have been but one poll and that at Lennox Island, thus awarding the election to Francis. The election at Morell took place on January 25th and at Lennox Island on February 12th. The election at Morell was held at that early date because of Sark's term as Chief ending on the last of January and on the request of the Indians of that place to have same held. When the Morell Indians were notified that on instructions from the Department the election would take place on Feb. 12th they considered it unnecessary to vote again. In defence of this Chief Sark in his protest contended that the poll at Morell at the election in 1900 was held one week previous to the one held at Lennox Island in order that the result of the poll might be in the hands of the returning officer on the day of the polling on Lennox Island. When the matter was placed before the Department of Indian Affairs, through Messrs. McQuarrie & Arsenault, a new election was granted.
