JOHN 14. Commit vs. 2, 3. MAY 3.

OUR HEAVENLY HOME. GOLDEN TEXT:—"In my Father's house are many mansions." John 14: 2. Time.—Tuesday night, April 4, A.D. 30. Place.—Upper room, Jerusalem.

EXPOSITION. I. "I will come again, 1-3. The 14th chapter of John is the richest vein in the most remarkable gold mine in the world—the Bible. The first clause of verse 1 is the keynote of the chapter, especially of verses 1 to 27. Verse 27 verse 1 begin with the words. All in between might fitly be entitled thoughts for the comfort and encouragement of believers during the absence of their Lord. The remainder of the verse contains Jesus' infallible prescriptions for heart trouble (see Am. R. Y.). The only one who truly believes in God and believes in Jesus Christ will never be troubled in heart (Is. 26: 3). We can take our choice between believing hearts and troubled hearts. When faith comes in, anxiety goes out.

II. The way to the Father, 4-6. The third comforting thought was that they knew the place where He had gone and how to get there. To this statement Thomas interposed a doubt. Thomas' expression of doubt was the occasion of some very precious teaching. Verse 6 is one of the mountain peaks of scripture. It tells us the way to God. Jesus Himself is the way. That way is open to all (ch. 10: 9; 6: 37). How Jesus is the way the Bible makes very plain: (1) Eph. 2: 13, 18; Heb. 10: 19, 20; (2) Matt. 11: 27; John 17: 3; (3) Heb. 1: 1-3. He is not only the way, but "the truth" also. He is "the truth" incarnate.

III. "He that hath seen Me hath seen the Father," 7-11. If Jesus were a mere man and not divine in a unique sense then verse 7 would be appalling presumption and blasphemy. But Jesus had a right to say if they had known Me they should have known My Father also. God perfectly and fully revealed Himself in Jesus. So Jesus could say what He did. To know Jesus is to know God. To see Jesus is to see God. To know Jesus fully is to know God.

know God fully. Jesus is God manifest in the flesh. That was a cry of deep significance that Philip uttered. "Lord, show us the Father and it sufficeth us." Yes, that will suffice us to know anything else will. But for several years Philip had been looking at God and not seeing Him or knowing Him. There are many of this day who are just blind as Philip. Jesus longed to have Philip and the rest of the disciples to believe that He was in the Father and the Father in Him. And He longs to have us believe it also. His works prove it to all who have a discerning eye (vs. 10, 11).

IV. "He that believeth on Me, the works that I do shall he do also and greater works than these shall he do," vs. 12-14. Verse 12 contains another of the comforting thoughts to raise one dead in trespasses and sins to life. It is for each of us to claim our measures of this power. Verses 13 and 14, tell us how. These verses tell us of the prayer that gets just what it asks and anything it asks. It is prayer in the name of Christ. It is to pray upon the ground of Christ's claim. God not upon the grounds of any claims we imagine we have upon God. It is far more than to add to your petitions, "All this I ask in Jesus' name." We may say that and in reality not be praying in Jesus' name at all, but in reality praying in our own. But Jesus has given us a right to approach God on the ground of His claims upon Him, and when we do it, no matter how sinful we have been, Jesus Himself will do what we ask of the father in His name. But note to whom it is this promise is made. To those who are united to Jesus Christ by a living faith that reveals itself in an obedient love" (vs. 12-15).
