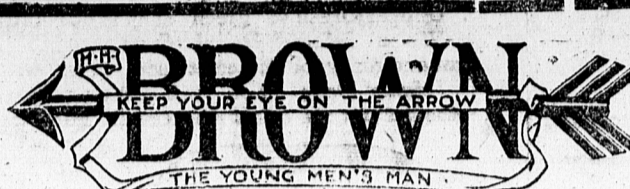
JANUARY 9. BAPTISM AND TEMPTATION OF JESUS. Matt. 3:13-17 4:1-11. GOLDEN TEXT.

was unto repentance. As a mother shares the shame of her prodigal boy or wayward girl, though her personal conduct is above suspicion or reproach, so it would appear that the consciousness of the sins of men whom He came to redeem so shadowed the spirit of Jesus that He sought the baptism of cleansing which they needed while He consecrated Himself to fulfil all righteousness. The humiliation of the manger cradle, of which the babe Jesus was unconscious, while thus from the un stainable heaven He became manifest in the flesh, was a humiliation which was voluntarily taken when upon the threshold of His sacrificial ministry and borne with unwavering willing ness until His death upon the Cross. He became poor. But His humiliation into the place of the sinful was His exaltation. The Spirit descended upon Him and He came in fullness His indwelling Guest, so that from the hour that the amazed John the Baptist granted the request of the Sinless One for a sin ner's baptism, it was evident to all that the Man of Nazareth went a bout, even as He went into the wilder ness, led by the Spirit. When the character is sealed and set in holiness it is pledged to victory. One day it shall be able to say: "I glorified Thee on the earth, having accomplish ed the work which Thou hast given

me to do." While that is so the devil does not seem to be aware of it. None are exempt from his strategic endeavors. He is prepared to try conclusions with Jesus. And it has to be confessed that the subtlety of man's adversary makes him a foe to be feared. The exhortation which warns men to beware of the wiles of the devil is made clear and clamant by the woe of ex perience of thousands who have been snared and taken. When Jesus was in solitude and when He hungered from long fasting and when He pondered and prayed and prepared His soul to meet the problem of His Messiahship, the devil tempt ed Him. It was after the vigil and the fasting, and at the moment of the flesh weariness of Jesus, that he came. It was the time to strike if any time was vulnerable. He lay in waiting for this hour. And he had three successive propo sitions to present of most plausible intent. They presented to Jesus cer tain methods of success. The devil did not seek to break down or divert the thought of Jesus from the mighty work for which He was born. On the other hand he suggested ways and means of a sure accomplishment. It is not often that a man's business or calling is at fault. The devil in him is seen in the way he goes about his business. The wily old foe does not care how many preachers there are or Sunday School teachers or scholars, so long as they will take ointments from him as to how to preach and teach and live. But Jesus Christ cannot be led into any false or God-dishonoring or God-tempting methods. And He de feats the enemy of malicious sugges tion by a definite appeal to the drill-book of conduct and character. He uses upon His foe the sword of the Spirit—the word of God. When the drill-book is known, the sword is found. The devil left Jesus. And angels succored Him. That was a splendid exchange. Where were the angels while the devil was in evidence? They do not harbor at the same port. The word of God is sufficient to make exit for the one and entrance for the other wherever in God's providence the lot of any man is cast.—Onward.
