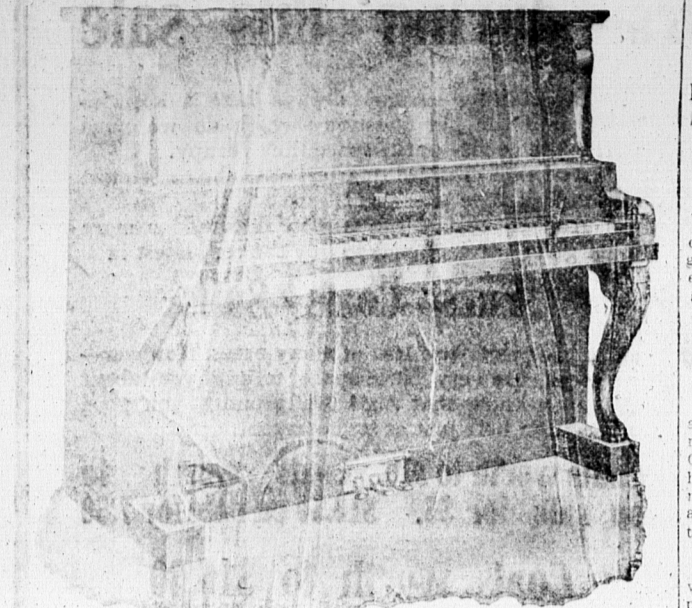

All honor to Captain Brown, who holds the ribbon, for being the first Master Marine to do justice to the port of Charlottetown.
