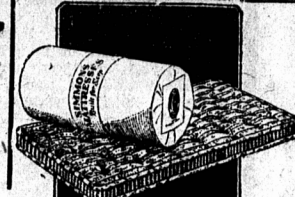
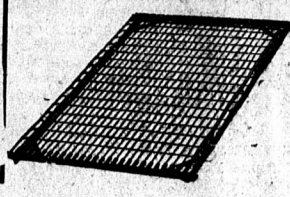

RETURN FROM CANADIAN NORTH.-Mr. G. Charles Batt of this city arrived in Charlottetown on the late train on Christmas Eve from Churchill which is to be the terminus of the Hudson Bay Railway. UNCLE RAY'S CORNER

THE CHINESE YEAR
What year do you suppose it is in China? "The same year it is here," you may reply—and that is correct in one way. Our old earth has been traveling around the sun for a certain number of years—many millions, scientists say—and the number is the same whether we live in China or in North America.



The building of the Great Wall is an important event in Chinese history.

Yet there is a difference. People of the western world count years from the time of Christ, and we say that we are now finishing the year 1928. The Chinese have a very different starting date for their calendar. If you went over there, and could speak the language, you

They begin their year with "the first moon" after the sun sets in the part of the sky containing the star group known as Aquarius. The moon does not rise at the same time each year, so the Chinese New Year comes at different times—between Jan. 21st and Feb. 19th, by our count. For three days, the Chinese celebrate the coming of the New Year. The streets are thronged with people dressed in their best clothes. Lanterns and flowers are hung at their doorways, and strips of red paper are pasted here and there. When a piece of blue paper is pasted around a doorway, it means that a death has occurred in the house during the past year. When Chinese meet each other during the feast time, they say, "Kung-hi, kung-hi!" (which means "I humbly wish you joy") or "Shih-hi, shih-hi!" (meaning "May joy be yours.")
