AMERICAN HISTORY AT THE EDEN MUSEUM.

At the Eden Musee of New York City, much attention has been paid to figures and groups representing important personages and events of American history. Many heroes and incidents of the Civil War are depicted in wax. There is the surrender of General Lee and the last moments of John Brown. There are also reproductions of famous battle scenes and struggles of early settlers. The latest addition to the historical group, consists of reproductions of death masks of all the Presidents of the United States. These have been arranged in the Crypt, in regular order, and are the most perfect reproductions of masks ever made. In fact, they equal those made in Paris, famous Zathoon Collection in Paris, of famous personages. The Coronation group and the moving pictures of the Coronation scenes continue to be of interest. Many visitors have seen these pictures time and time again. Many other moving pictures have just been received, and the hourly exhibitions, afternoon and evenings, will be of unusual interest. The afternoon and evening concerts continue to have pleasing programs. The Sunday concerts have programs which include vocal and instrumental solos.

OBITUARY.

It is with deepest regret the death of John McKaig, which took place on Thursday, the 24th inst., at his home in New Haven, is announced. The deceased, who was in his seventieth year, had been in failing health for a number of years, although his death was not anticipated by his family until within an hour of the final summons which all must obey. CUT THIS OUT AND PASTE IT UP

It is surprising the large number of people in this city who, when they want to inquire about their Morning Daily Guardian or subscription, ask Central for the News Phone No. 133, or for the Advertising Phone No. 132-3, instead of 132-2; or when they want to inquire about advertising ask Central for the Subscription Phone No. 132-2, or for the News Phone No. 133, instead of 132-3; or when they want the News or Editorial department ask Central for the Subscription Phone No. 132-2, or the Advertising Phone No. 132-2, instead of 133, although all those departments and their respective phone numbers are plainly given in the telephone book. Some people, instead of looking at the book, even when one of the above departments to find out what number to ask for to get another department. All this is a great waste of time on the part of the person phoning, the operator at the Central, and the clerk in the department wrongly phoned. The news staff, on an upper floor, cannot give the necessary information about either advertising or subscriptions, nor the advertising staff about subscriptions or news, nor the subscription staff about advertising or news. In other words the clerks know and cannot do but their work in their own departments, and if it were otherwise they would be continually running from one department to another, up stairs and down, mixing work, wearing themselves out and causing the greatest possible confusion. On and after 7 p.m. daily it is useless to ask for any phone number except 133. Patrons who consult their phone books for the numbers they really want will greatly lessen the work of the patient Central telephone and their lives much brighter and happier.
