MORNING MARKET LETTER

Gains at the opening yesterday were added to during the morning with the steel, auto, rail, oil and rubber stocks leading in strength.

Sentiment was aided by excellent March earnings reports of a number of the major rail systems, and General Motors showing for the first quarter was moderately better than expected.

The U. S. Steel earnings were about in line with the more conservative street estimates and the dividend action taken makes it quite probable that the remaining arrears can be cleared up at the close of the current quarter and some distribution made on the common.

The decline has carried most stocks down to levels where they look reasonably priced on earnings even allowing for a summer lull in business.

CHICAGO, April 28—(AP)—For the second day in succession, the corn market today rallied for the first time since the market became a downward trend of other grains.

May corn rose abruptly at times to around the extreme permissible limit, four cents a bushel. Traders in sore need of corn to meet contract obligations displayed unabated anxiety, and bid higher prices with little or no attempt at restraint.

At the close, corn was ranging from 3-4 lower to three cents higher compared with yesterday's close.

Perhaps the most striking and most quickly worked consists of pieces of felt, cut and fitted together upon a suitable background.

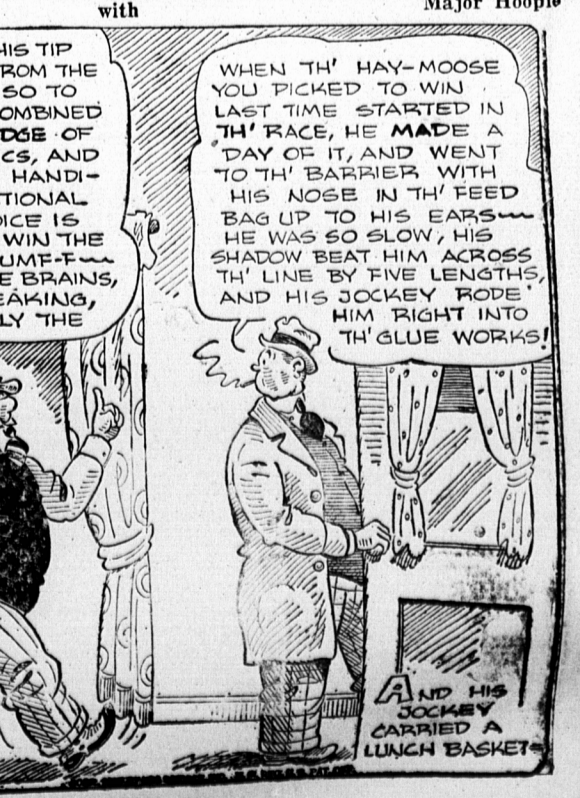

Large and bold-looking flower-pieces are also suitable for this kind of work. Here, scraps of velvet may be incorporated into the design with various beads or sequins for the centres of the flowers.

In some instances, the cut-out fabrics are simply stuck to the background, and any actual stitching consists of veining, or of couching gilt thread around some of the petals.
