HALF MILLION LAND DEAL PUT THROUGH.

TORONTO, Ont., Jan. 12—A land deal, which was probably the largest in the history of Canada and certainly the largest cash transaction on record in Toronto, was put through yesterday in the Canadian Northern offices when John E. Hansen, of Winnipeg, purchased from Colonel A. D. Davidson, acting for Mackenzie, Mann & Co., a lot of property of the value of \$5,500,000.

The land bought includes a first choice of the area acquired by the Canadian Northern for development in the city of Montreal, a quantity of inside and waterfront property in the new city of Port Mann on the Pacific coast, and land at numerous important points along the line of the Canadian Northern in the west, including two as yet unnamed town sites in British Columbia about midway between Edmonton and Vancouver.

A BASEBALL LEAGUE BUT NOT A BASEBALL WAR

CHICAGO, Jan. 15—Threats of the "outlaw" baseball league entering cities now occupied by the American Association, National or American League teams took a concrete form here when the Columbian League was organized.
