WHY NO IMMIGRANTS TO THIS PROVINCE.

Much complaint has been made that the Maritime Provinces have not shared in the benefits of the large expenditure for immigration. Just now an improvement is noted so far as Nova Scotia is concerned, which is so far, gratifying. In the speech at the opening of the Legislature in Halifax last week the Governor was able to announce that, "during the past year many desirable settlers have been located in the province under the direction of the Department of Industries and Immigration. While the majority of these have found employment on farms of the Province, many possessing capital have settled in homes of their own." The fact that this is occurring in Nova Scotia gives hope that a like favorable change may yet be brought about in New Brunswick and Prince Edward Island also.

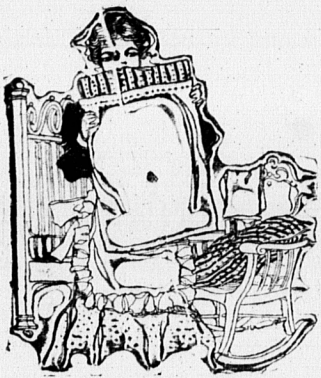

Private advices from Ottawa say that much better progress is being made with the public business this year than last year and it is hoped that prorogation will be reached early in June next.

Sharply following the announcement from Ottawa that the Government would place the Intercolonial under the control of a commission, comes the flat contradiction from Hon. Mr. Graham. We are now told that when the statement of the commission plan being adopted was shown to him, the minister stated "that it was a pure figment of the imagination and there was not a word of truth in it." What will be the next report?

You can see running through all their panegyrics, their eulogies, their articles and memorial services, an un-called-for adoration, an effort not only toward making not only a Man of Sorrows, but a Savior also, out of the Kentucky backwoodsman who became the leader of an imperishable cause.

When our Government gave \$2,500 to the Quebec Battlegrounds fund the general judgment is that it was too much. Ontario has twenty-one times our population, has vast resources and is much nearer to the scene, but if we remember rightly, was not so generous in proportion.

Recently near Calcutta the native lawyer who prosecuted some of the sedition mongers was assassinated in open court. An attempt to blow up a train on which the Viceroy was expected to have taken passage was reported the next day. Such occurrences have become so frequent as to arouse perpetual concern.

An act of the Parliament of Canada, now more than fifty years old, required the Grand Trunk Railway to give third-class fares at a penny a mile between certain points on its lines. It has never been enforced. A Mr. Robertson last year tendered a two cent rate and was refused passage by the agent of the company. He entered action and followed it up from court to court until it reached the Privy Council. Judgment was given by that court on February 17 affirming that the act imposing a third-class fare at a two-cent rate is still in force.

An extra of the Canada Gazette announces that the British Columbia Immigration Act, commonly spoken of as the Natal Act of which it is in its main features a copy, has been formally disallowed by the Governor General in Council.
