The Ottawa Citizen, remarking upon the fact that Sir Charles Tupper has sold his residence in Ottawa to remove to British Columbia, pays a warm and fitting tribute to the late Conservative leader. The Citizen also intimates that Sir Charles will probably devote his leisure to the preparation of his political memoirs. Such a work from such hands and covering so long and eventful a period in the history of Canada as the past half century has been could hardly fail to prove of the greatest interest and value. The Citizen moreover indulges the hope that Sir Charles Tupper may yet return to Ottawa clothed with the state and dignity of Governor General of the Dominion. Many would be glad to see the intimation realised, but we do not think it probable that at any early date a Canadian statesman will be appointed to that position.

Some surprise will naturally be felt at the announcement of the resignation of Mr. David Pottinger, the General Manager of Government Railways. Mr. Pottinger was born at Pictou in 1843 and was educated at the Academy in that town. When twenty years of age he entered the railway service as clerk in the office of the Nova Scotia Railway at Halifax. He rose step by step until he reached the high position which he has now resigned. He was appointed Cashier of the N. S. Railway in 1871, and after the consolidation with the Intercolonial became Station Master at Halifax in 1872. In 1874 he became Storekeeper of the Railway, and in 1890 General Superintendent. In 1892 he was appointed General Manager of Government Railways, with a salary of \$6,000. Holding these high positions under successive Governments Mr. Pottinger has shown himself an energetic and capable railway man and commended in large measure the respect and regard of the general public. An Ottawa despatch announces that his successor will be named within a few days.
