OUR REPRESENTATIVE.

The redistribution bill is now being prepared at Ottawa, and from all the accounts given out it is the intention that it shall reduce the representation of this Island in the Commons to four members. Our original representation of six has been already reduced to five which fact makes it the more difficult to now defeat the proposed further reduction. The question is urgent, for the meeting of Parliament is now near at hand, and what can be done must be done quickly, if at all.

The outlet is the less cheerful from the fact that our political influence in the Councils of the Dominion seems to be less today than ever before. And there is the fact that Quebec is increasing, and likely to increase in population more rapidly than Prince Edward Island in the future.

It is quite clear that conditions are arising which neither our Island statesmen of the past, nor the fathers of confederation in the Dominion ever contemplated when the terms of union were adopted. With Quebec as the pivot of our representative system, always limited to the fixed number of 65 representatives, and with the other Provinces having a like proportion of representation to population, what may happen? We have had a population of 52 to 54 to the square mile, which of late is diminishing. Quebec has had a population of 3 to 4 per square mile, and it is increasing. Let it be supposed that Quebec shall go on increasing until her population shall become but half as dense as that of Prince Edward Island, say 26 to the square mile, while our own population remains stationary, what then would be our position? Quebec with a population of nine millions would still have but 65 members, or one member for each 138,000 people. It is clear that according to the official construction of the B. N. A. Act Prince Edward Island would then only be entitled to a single member at most.
