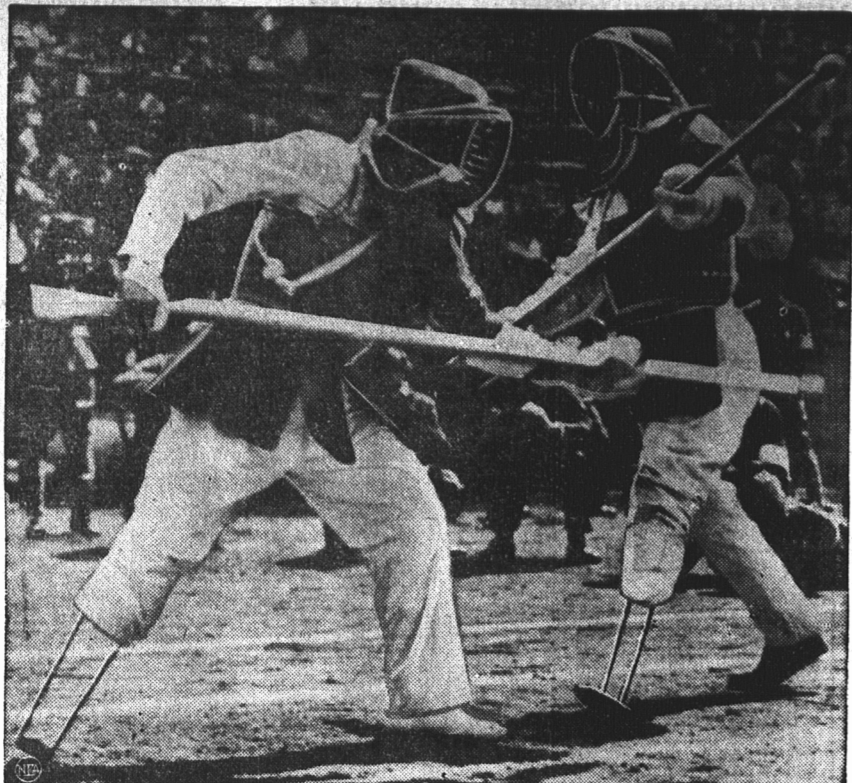

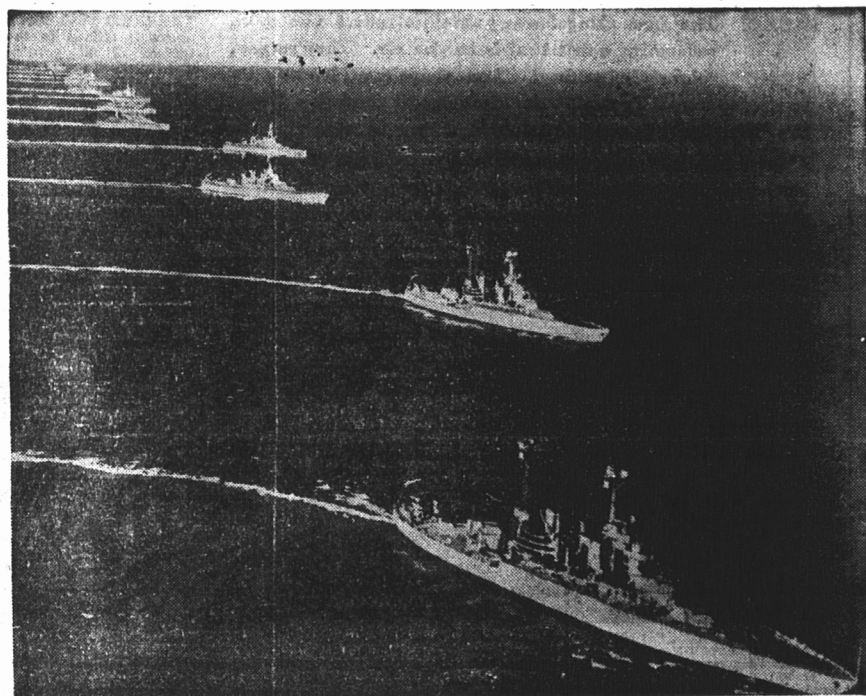

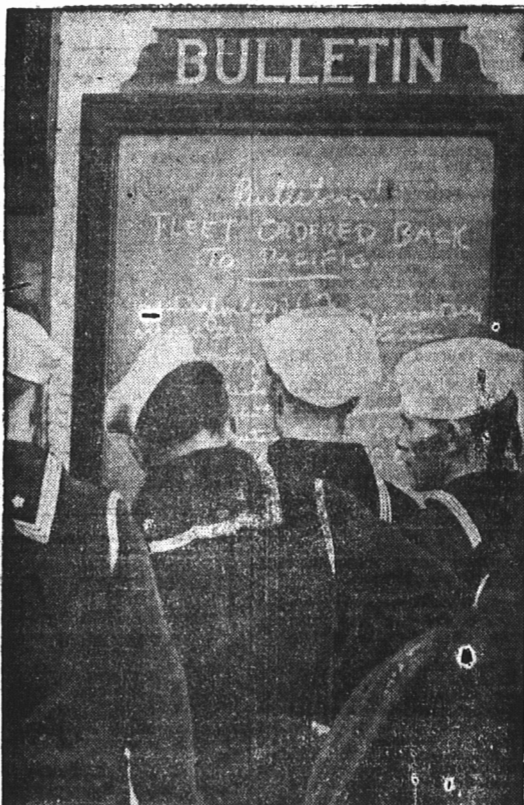
Flanked by police, Charles Lindbergh comes down the gangplank of the Aquitania, returning to U. S. for the first time for some years.



Among the treasures the British Government is to place on exhibition in its pavilion at the New York World's Fair is this priceless piece of plate, the Calix Majestatis or "Cup of Majesty". Made to commemorate the coronation of King George and Queen Elizabeth, it bears the Royal coat of arms with the familiar lion and unicorn, and is surmounted by a smaller lion. It is a fine example of the goldsmith's art which conditions of today give little scope for expression.



The group of Uncle Sam's mighty warships, above make a quick turn about, as if in response to one of the most drastic peace-time orders ever issued. With part of the fleet already in New York, and the rest of the 98 ships and 43,000 men speeding up the Atlantic for the opening of the New York World's Fair, the Navy Department ordered an immediate about face and return without delay to bases in the Pacific.

Britain's "spare-time" volunteer army, long regarded with patronising indulgence, today enjoys the nation's fullest respect, having been given a task of mature proportions. The Territorials, under present arrangements represent Britain's ground defence against air raids, a heavy responsibility in present unsettled conditions in Europe. Guns of the newest type are being produced in quantity, and the forces are being trained in their operation with the utmost dispatch. These pictures show a gun crew in training at Shoeburyness, operating a new anti-aircraft gun of Swedish design. The 40-millimetre shells are loaded in whips, and the rapid fire of a battery of these weapons is said to make a large zone in the air impervious to aircraft.

Heads of great governments in this hour are literally responsible for the fate of humanity in the coming years. History will hold them accountable for the lives and the happiness of all—even unto the least.

I hope that your answer will make it possible for humanity to lose fear and regain security for many years to come.

FRANKLIN D. ROOSEVELT

In the most dramatic step taken by an American statesman since the World War, President Roosevelt, pictured here at the time his message was announced, personally appealed to Hitler and Mussolini to give Europe and the world a ten-year breathing spell of peace. Below are shown the closing paragraphs of the unprecedented message.
