Experts Listen As "Waves" Talk

HAMILTON, Bermuda, Oct. 21 — There used to be a popular song called "I wonder what the wild waves are saying," but the "wonder" is being removed by oceanographic scientists, a group of whom have arrived here in the Atlantis research vessel of the Woods Hole Oceanographic Institute, for a study of Bermuda's deep waters.
The waves can talk. And what they say will have a great deal to do in making the highway, the oceans a safer proposition. Scientists have learned that waves, indicative of the weather to follow, roll on ahead of storms, before the storm. Thus a systematic study of waves may be used to forecast weather.

Side Pleated Skirts Show

LONDON, Oct. 26 — A young Scotsman, Olive Duncan has broken into the world of fashion with his first dress parade in which his designs showed an admirable flair for combining the rather extravagant styles of today with practicability.
Slightly rounded hiplines were shown on jackets worn over slim-fitting skirts. Some skirts, for the sake of originality, were pleated at the side instead of the front or back. Others had more "simple" adaptations of the tulip style skirt.
He showed a white wool lace calf-length dinner gown with low cut neck, very small ruffled bodice and fitted skirt.
A well-tailored copper-colored coat had five-inch turned back cuffs with a pocket concealed in each cuff.
His designs shared the limelight with those of the Millinery Information Centre — an association of hat manufacturers — which displayed a range of smart and stylish hats at prices ranging from 11s 6d to four guineas (\$2.60 to \$18.80).
Until recently it was almost impossible to obtain a hat here much under four guineas.
The Millinery Centre said it believes that women are anxious to wear hats again if they can be bought at prices within their income and are eager to have advice as to how and when to wear them.
Hat styles at present tend to follow off-the-face lines with varying adaptations of the louche beret and bonnet, and particularly of the bathing cap style of the 1920's with crowns fitting closely and smoothly over the back of head down to the nape of the neck.
Berms are rolled gently and softly with pom-poms or feather plumes sweeping high into the air or draping down to the shoulders against the side of the face.
