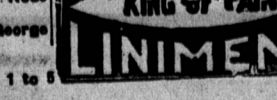

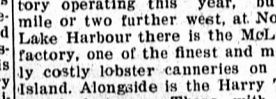

WHERE LOBSTERS ARE FISHED—From Little Harbour to the East Point light on the south side there are no lobster factories, as there doesn't appear to be any of the crustaceous in the waters in that vicinity. Strange as it may appear, at least these fishing grounds (famous Hake-fishing grounds) do not warrant the erections of factories but from East Point westerly on the North side, there is a cannery about on an average every two miles, and the majority of them large factories, too. At the very East Point below the light-houses is the McIntyre factory.

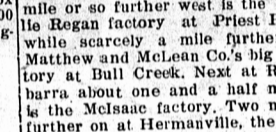
This factory was established forty years ago by the late McDonald and Murphy, Sours. A mile or two further west is the East Lake factory, built some years ago by the Hon. Lauchlin McDonald. At Black Point, a mile west, there is no factory operating this year, but a mile or two further west, at North Lake Harbour there is the McLean factory, one of the finest and most costly lobster canneries on the island. Alongside is the Harry Tidmarsh factory. These, with the harbour accommodation, are splendid fishing sites. A mile west is the Sterns factory and a little further on, at Campbell's Cove is the Portland Packing Co's factory. A mile or so further west is the Willie Regan factory at Priest Pond while scarcely a mile further is Matthew and McLeod Co's big factory at Bull Creek. Next at Rock Barra, about one and a half miles is the McIsaac factory. Two miles further on at Hermanville, the McEachern Bros' factory but packing their catch at McIsaac's Black Bush. At Black Bush A. D. McIsaac's new factory is operating on a larger scale than ever. This factory was established in 1882 by Doyle and McBride, Sours.
