On The Trail Of A Witch.

Mother and Daughter Say They Are Under a Spell and Want It Removed.

New York March 1.—Rosa Rittenberg, a young woman who lives with her mother at 24 East Broadway, says that she is suffering from a hypnotic spell cast upon her a year ago by the housekeeper of a neighboring tenement. The mother asserts that she is also a sufferer from the same sort of witchery. The two have asked the police to arrest the woman, who, they believe, is a witch. The "spell," whatever it is, certainly is causing the couple much mental suffering.

"When we met the witch," said Rosa yesterday, "mother and I were living in Allen Street. We had been in this country only a short time.
