During February, Uncle Sam shipped us 1,872,426 dozen of eggs, while in return he took from Canada only 287 dozen.

We are importing eggs from the United States under a duty of three cents a dozen. When we want to sell eggs in the United States we go in there over a duty of eight cents a dozen.

TWO PICTURES

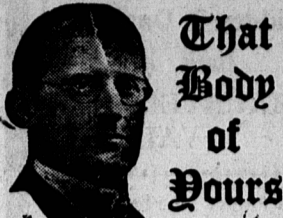
A bye-election in South Africa the other day resulted in the defeat of the government candidate and the reduction of the government's majority to four.

HALIFAX, April 14.—There is little evidence of poverty in Germany today, was the statement made by S. Barrow, manager at Quebec for the Robert Reford Company, who disembarked here today from the Cunard liner Ausonia and who has just recently completed a tour of Germany.

In Berlin and Hamburg, he said, the people showed no signs of poverty. There oysters were selling at fifteen cents, or about \$3.75 per dozen, and the chefs are kept busy supplying the demand, while lobsters in the shell are meeting a ready demand at 18 cents per pound, and other foods were selling at proportionately high prices.

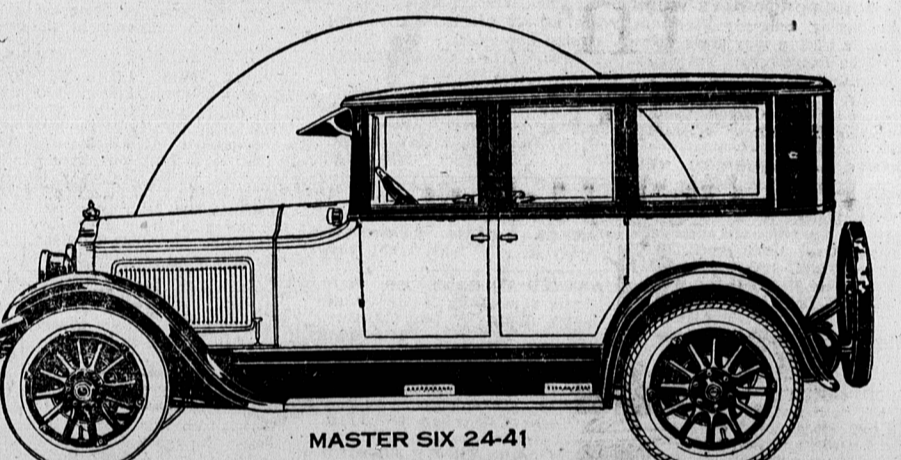
