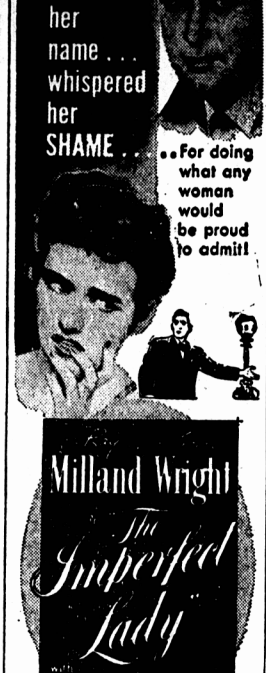

CANADIAN PRIME

As mentee of the occasion Mr. King has photographs of the plane dropping the plasma, the first "drop" of which missed the ship and went overboard, being picked up by a boat crew. A second "drop" landed cleanly on the forward deck.

Among the 1,200 other passengers on the ship which departed at 6:15 p.m. EST, was Rabbi Baruch Korff, co-chairman of the Political Action Committee for Palestine who was arrested in Paris Sept. 7 with eight others allegedly implicated in a plot to "bomb" London with stern Gang leaflets. Rabbi Korff was released last week when the French police dropped the charges.

4. Composition of the conference of information which will also be an organ of the peace conference. Molotov dropped the Soviet proposal that the four main committees should comprise only members of the Big Four in favor of a French proposal leaving with the Big Four the right to invite representatives of the smaller Allies.

Courts de Murville, deputizing for Foreign Minister Bidault of France who was in Paris for consultations with Premier Schuman, said he interpreted the French proposal to mean that all the smaller Allies who were interested could be members of the main committees. The task of the committees would be to supervise and coordinate sub-committees which would do the real work and on which all the smaller Allies would be represented.

But neither Marshall nor Bevin were satisfied with the explanation. The British view was that the committee should consist of the Big Four and the 19 states which took an active part in fighting Germany. The United States considered they should consist of the Big Four and an "appropriate number of other states."

No agreement was reached and the question was referred to the deputies. The Ministers agreed to begin tomorrow's meeting at 3 p.m. so that they could finish in time to take tea with King George at 6 p.m. The Japanese invented the folding fan in the seventh century.
