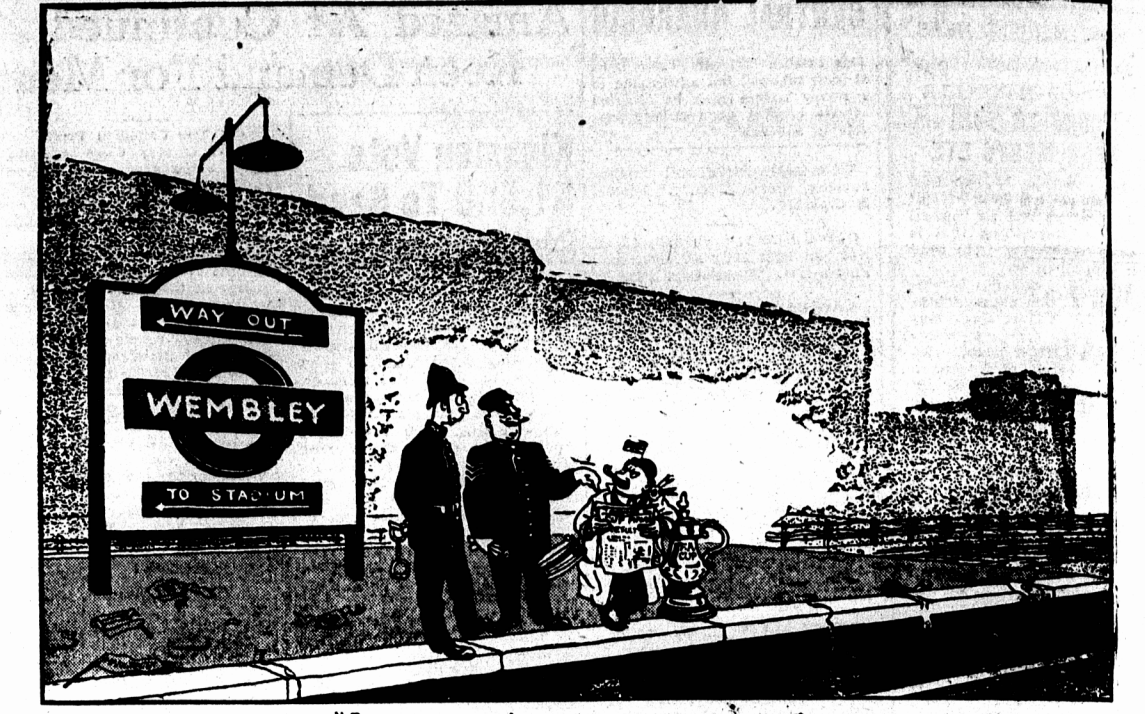

Weekly Market Report

SUMMARY
Liberal cattle receipts on eastern markets sold at firm to slightly higher prices while drastically reduced deliveries on western markets, due to weather and road conditions, brought advances of \$1 to \$2 per cwt. Eastern calf prices advanced moderately but western calves gained \$2 or more per cwt. Hogs and sheep and lambs were mostly unchanged.

Eastern Cattle Markets

Toronto cattle prices were fully 25c higher on all grades. Top for weighty steers was \$18.75, with others from \$18.50 downward to \$16.50. Butcher steers were \$18.50 to \$18.75 and a few choice \$18.50. Early trading was active at Montreal on all classes of stock. The few good steers offered brought \$16 to \$17, with a few choice ones at \$14 to \$15.50, and common light steers down to \$11. Choice steers and heifers at Moncton brought \$16 f.o.b. country points.

Western Cattle Markets

General average prices at western markets reached an all-time high record this week. At Winnipeg a few outstanding steers made \$19.50, other desirable slaughter steers \$18.50 to \$19.5, and just ordinary good steers \$17 to \$22 higher. Prices were \$1 to \$2 higher with one load of strictly choice calves selling at \$18.00. Edmonton had a practical top of \$18.50 Prince Albert \$18, Moose Jaw \$18, Saskatoon \$19, and Regina \$18. Vancouver quoted good to choice steers at \$17.25.

Exports to United States

Exports of dairy cattle to the United States for the week ending April 29th were 2,436 compared with 897 in the same week last year. Exports to date this year are 22,989 compared with 13,037 in the same period last year.

Calf Markets

Calves were \$1 per cwt. higher at Toronto, selling at \$20 to \$22 per cwt. while Montreal was up 50c with good quality vealers \$18 to \$20. Calves at Winnipeg were \$2 or more higher, with good to choice veal \$20 to \$25. Calgary quoted good vealers at \$15 to \$18, and Edmonton \$18 to \$20, both \$2 to \$2.50 higher. Best available calves at Prince Albert were \$18 and at Saskatoon up to \$24.50.

Hog Markets

Hog prices were generally unchanged, with Toronto quoting Grade A at \$29, Montreal \$25, Winnipeg \$27.50, Calgary \$27.50, and Edmonton unchanged at \$28.25. The above prices do not include the Dominion Government premium of \$2 per head on Grade A and \$1 per head on Grade B1.
