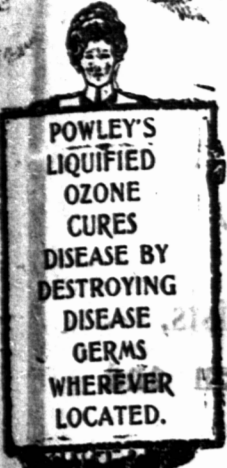

**FIVE NEW SEATS ON CHANGE.**

MONTREAL, March 20.—The members of the Montreal Stock Exchange this morning voted to increase the membership of the Exchange from fifty-five to sixty seats. It was further agreed that the minimum price at which these seats were to be sold is \$25,000 each. This will go into the hands of the Exchange's treasurer not less than \$125,000. The highest price yet paid for a seat on the Exchange was \$37,500.

**HOW LLOYD'S GETS ITS NEWS**

**It Has Its Representatives in All Parts of the World**

**Not One Vessel in Ten From Abroad Arrives Without Being First Reported by Lloyd's.**

The majority of people have but very hazy conception of what Lloyd's really is, the popular notion being that it is a place where one can insure against practically anything and everything. This is quite correct as far as it goes. But the fact is generally overlooked that, in addition to insuring against disaster at sea, not to mention typhoid, smallpox, coronitis or professions, Lloyd's is an enormous organization for the collection and distribution of marine intelligence.

Indeed it is no exaggeration to say that Lloyd's possesses the smartest intelligence department in the world, and was originally established about a century and a quarter ago to meet the public desire for information with regard to vessels at sea. It is mainly owing to the remarkable fact that there is no line of sea coast in the whole world which is not watched by its agents that Lloyd's is able to collect and distribute its marine intelligence with far greater rapidity than any other institution in the world. And since the introduction of cable and telegraph the work of the intelligence department has of course developed enormously.

In addition, however, to having representatives all over the world, Lloyd's has its signal stations at all points of the globe, and it is chiefly by means of these that underwriters, shipping owners, and merchants at home are kept informed of the exact locality of their vessels.

It is an astonishing fact that not one vessel in ten bound to ports in the United Kingdom from abroad, arrives at her destination without first being reported from one of Lloyd's signal stations. As a ship proceeds on its voyage, and passes Lloyd's agents and stations, the news is flashed by telegraph and cable to the intelligence department. The information is thereupon immediately entered in one of a series of great volumes, in which can be found the position of every overseas ship, or the date and place at which she was last spoken.

As regards the code of signaling between a station and passing vessels, it is interesting to note that only one is adopted by all the nations of the world. Briefly stated, the code is worked by means of twenty-six flags, these representing separate letters of the alphabet, and one pennant for replying. From these twenty-six flags no fewer than one hundred thousand distinct combinations can be obtained.

Outside each station is a tall mast from which the lead signals are worked, and flying from this are two flags, bearing the letters 'B. D.' which means 'What ship is that?' When a vessel passes the station it displays her national ensign and four flags, each of which letter represents a letter, and by the aid of his telescope and register the signal master is thus able to determine the name of the ship. He thereupon answers with his pennant that he understands, and then goes to the telegraph instrument and wires to Lloyd's that he has spoken such and such a ship.

The captain of each vessel also reports at the signal stations any information regarding derelicts, wrecks or any disasters to other ships which he may have witnessed, and in this way the news quickly reaches London, and is flashed all over the world. The country to which a passing vessel belongs is quite immaterial. It may hail from China, Turkey or Japan, and have no one on board capable of speaking a word of English. Still it can readily make itself understood, the registered signal letters being the same for all countries.—London 'Tit-bits.'

Both his legs had been amputated owing to frost bites incurred one night in winter when he deserted from fear of ill-treatment.

**"TELEPHONE DON'TS"**

Don't tap on the telephone of the transmitter or receiver with a pencil or other article. You may injure the apparatus, the ear piece of the receiver may be removed and an examination of the diaphragm made. If bent replace it with a new one and screw on the cap until it sets firmly in place.

Don't drop the receiver or throw it down you are apt to break it if you do. The shell is made of hard rubber and is brittle.

Don't experiment with the interior mechanism if you are not posted on telephony.

Don't talk in a loud voice because you do not hear the speaker at the other end of the line very well. The difficulty may be in your receiver.

Don't expect satisfactory results when your receiver or its broken, binding post screws loose, or where interior contacts have grown poor from want of attention.

Don't expect your telephone to give satisfaction if the batteries are exhausted or connections at binding posts corroded.

Don't expect your telephone to operate if you have forgotten to hang up the receiver and left the battery on a short circuit for several hours; that is, not until it has recuperated, or you have replaced it with another.

Don't place on top of the machine articles of metal. If you do, your telephone may short circuit and you cannot call out to line.

Don't open the door out of curiosity and then forget to lock it again.

Don't short circuit the instrument by jamming a leaf pencil between the lighting arrester points.

Don't stand too far from the transmitter while talking. Remember, a good telephone is so constructed that it will not gather up distant sounds and is adjusted to a view to short range operation. Talk from two to six inches from the mouth piece according to the length of line over which you are talking and the privacy of your conversation.

Don't talk loud,—it is unnecessary—but talk clearly and not too fast.

Don't blame the telephone if you do not perfectly understand at all times the party at the other end of the line.

Remember that all voices are not alike some are particularly well adapted to telephone conversation, while others are very unsatisfactory.

Don't complain to the office that your telephone is out of order until you are sure of it. Trouble at the other end of the line will, in all probability affect your instrument.

Don't forget to ring off when through talking. Don't expect to obtain good results unless you do your share in keeping up the apparatus and line.

Don't expect the best treatment in the world if you have given them occasion to put your telephone on the list of "chronic kickers."

Don't waste the operator's time in useless talk. Remember the care of her subscribers to the exchange who also expect her prompt response to their calls.

Don't lose your patience; you are simply powerless, and loss of temper only makes a bad matter worse. If the exchange is not treating you properly, report it, and if no relief is afforded, report you are in the right, and your telephone taken out.
