PRESIDENT MITCHELL HARANGUES

The Miners to Accept Proposed Arbitration

OBJECTIONABLE FEATURES

Are Found in the Proposal—President Roosevelt's Action Declared to be Justifiable.

PRESIDENT MITCHELL SPEAKS.

WILKESBARRE, Oct. 20.—(Special)—In opening the miner's convention, President Mitchell strongly urged upon the miners the acceptance of the arbitration proposition, saying that while he recognized that the proposition had many objectionable features, he was firm in the conviction that the prompt acceptance of it would secure a greater measure of justice than was enjoyed in the past or that could be attained by continuing the conflict in face of the President's intervention, which he said was perfectly justifiable when the country was threatened with a coal famine.

ROBERTS MAY COME.

LONDON October 17.—The Halifax Herald learns that Generals Corbin, Young and Wood have tendered Earl Roberts a cordial invitation to visit the United States and that the British commander-in-chief will possibly go to America next spring. Earl Roberts told the American Generals at a late hour this evening that he had practically decided to accept their invitation and go to the United States in December of 1903, and that there was a possibility of his crossing in time to witness the international yacht races in that year. It is Earl Roberts' desire that Generals French and Kelly-Kenny accompany him.
