THE COOK'S CORNER

CEREAL MUFFINS

2 cups flour
2 tablespoons sugar
2 tablespoons melted fat
1 egg
1-2 teaspoon salt
5 teaspoons baking powder
1 cup cooked cereal
1 cup milk

Dry ingredients. Add half of milk to cereal and mix into dry ingredients. Stir in the beaten egg, remaining milk and melted fat, and stir only until mixed. Pour into hot greased muffin pans and bake at 400 F. for 25-30 minutes.

WHOLE WHEAT PUDDING

1-2 cups cooked whole wheat
1-4 cup brown sugar
1-4 cup molasses
1-2 teaspoon soda
1-2 teaspoon salt
1 cup raisins
1-2 cup milk
3 tablespoons melted butter
1-2 teaspoon vanilla

Mix cereal, sugar salt, and then add raisins. Add well-beaten egg and milk mixed together, then molasses and melted butter. Add the soda dissolved in boiling water. Turn, at once into well greased mould. Steam 1-2 hours. Serve with cream or milk.

LAUNDERING TIP

Foundation garments give better service if laundered frequently and correctly, for the simple reason that perspiration and natural body oils tend to deteriorate the materials ordinarily used in their manufacture. A good general rule is to use moderately temperatured soft water, handle gently (and this means it's not necessary to either rub on a board or wring), use a mild soap, dry at room temperature, and press only the fabric parts of the garment with a moderate iron. If you are laundering several garments at a time and they are of different colors, sort and wash accordingly. Slide fasteners should be closed while laundering. Use two or even three sudsy baths, if necessary. Rinse thoroughly until water is absolutely clear. Blue lightly only white foundation garments.

WASHABLE HOUSECOAT

No matter how gay the print or how flowing the lines, a soiled hemline or collar will spoil the allure of the most charming housecoat. Washable housecoats are the answer. A short soaking in a mild suds will take out most of the soil, but neckline and hemline will probably need a bit of rubbing. After the first cleansing, use a second suds bath and then at least three clear, lukewarm rinses. If the housecoat is narrow and slim, dry it on a wooden coat hanger; if full skirted, with a circular cut, pin the skirt to two parallel lines. Always

press with the weave of the cloth in order to preserve an even neckline.
