Conservative Leader Heard In Scathing Indictment Of Moribund Liberal Regime

Government Sins Of Omission And Commission Reviewed From Angle Of Farmers And Fishermen In Rousing Speech By Hon. Dr. W. J. P. MacMillan

Turning the spotlight on the Liberal record of the past four years in this Province and at Ottawa, on the wreckage of broken pledges, mounting debt, increased taxation, Star Chamber legislative methods and invasion of the rights and liberties of British citizenship, Hon. Dr. W. J. P. MacMillan, Provincial Conservative leader, in a ringing speech at Wednesday's convention of the Second District of Queen's appealed for 100 per cent support in restoring responsible government at the next election.

His plea was answered by enthusiastic applause from the audience which included many visitors as well as delegates, who kept demanding "More!" from the speaker notwithstanding the limited time available after the business of the convention had been despatched.

The Doctor was in vigorous form, and directed scathing fire on the Liberal campaign conducted in the constituency in 1935, on the manner in which conditions at that time had been exploited and the unscrupulous promises made to fool the electors and defeat the Conservative administration.

"With these men as your representatives in Queen's," Dr. MacMillan continued, "I hope that the district will wipe out the disgrace which occurred on July 22, 1935. If there is any district which should remember the Conservative Government with gratitude, it is surely this constituency which, through the efforts of Messrs. McLure, Myers and myself, obtained a hundred thousand dollars from the federal treasury for the paved highway from Rustico to Hunter River. The Dominion Government paid the full cost of that paving project, which we obtained and for which our Liberal opponents are now seeking to take credit."

A Costly Representative

In contrast to this achievement Dr. MacMillan cited the record of Hon. B. W. LePage. "He went to London," (Laughter.)
