APPEARS LIKE A DESERTED VILLAGE. EL PASO, TEXAS, June 12.—Juarez, cut off from communication with the rest of Mexico, had all the appearance of a deserted village today. A large portion of the civilian population had sought refuge in El Paso and the 2,500 troops were either confined to barracks or on duty in the trenches and other defences of the city.

So far as is definitely known the nearest rebels are at Gaudalupé, thirty miles east of Juarez, where they have a large force of cavalry.
